We provided volunteers for:

- Landscape maintenance at Lakewood Center
- Repair of the Snow Flake Lights for the downtown Holiday Tree

The generosity of the club and its members provided funds for:

- Oswego Heritage Council

Other Local activities included:

- Sponsoring a 4-Way Test Speech Contest
- Hosted an Intern from Tanzania
- Distributing dictionaries to third grade students
- Constructed a children's shelter at Luscher Farms
- Distributed \$10,000 in scholarships to senior high school students



Internationally we:

Continued our Tanzanian Orphaned Children Project by:

- Establishing eight more agricultural income generating cooperatives which planted 14,400 Avocado Tree Seedlings
- Built 2 Secondary School Classrooms and completed 3 primary school Classrooms
- Provided Scholarships in the form of Uniforms, Shoes and School Supplies for 565 students

Elsewhere around the world we:

- Led a \$28,000 Transportation project in El Salvador
- Led a Clean Water Project in Tanzania for \$6,350

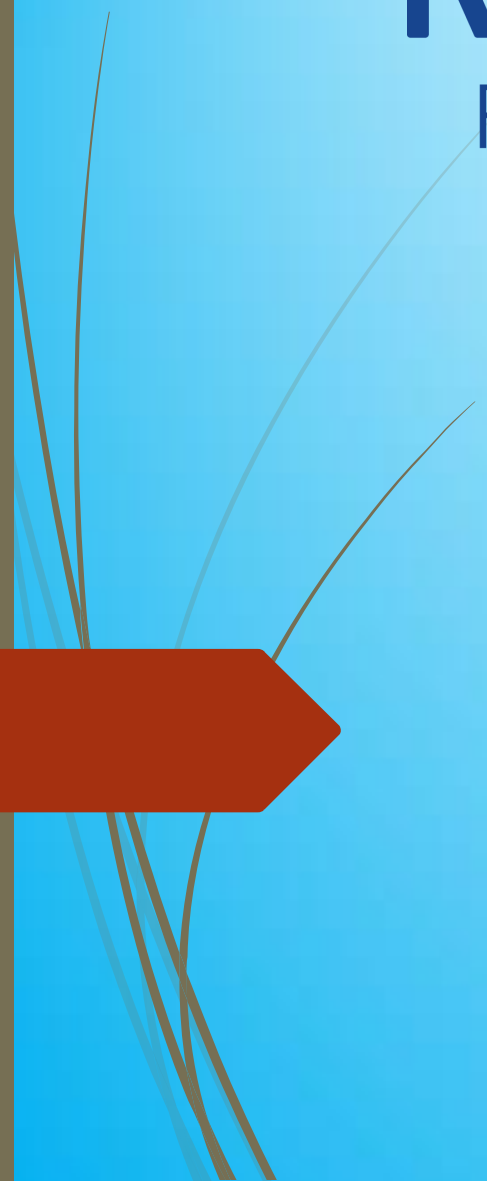
Partnered with other District 5100 clubs on:

- \$32,600 Clean Water Project in India
- \$54,000 Wheelchair Project in Guatemala
- \$13,500 Clean Water Project in Indonesia
- \$33,000 Clean Water Project in Costa Rica

- \$21,000 Dental Equipment Project in Nepal

We also made financial commitments for:

- School Desks in Cambodia in the amount of \$780
- And Contributed \$2,250 toward educational scholarships in Guatemala

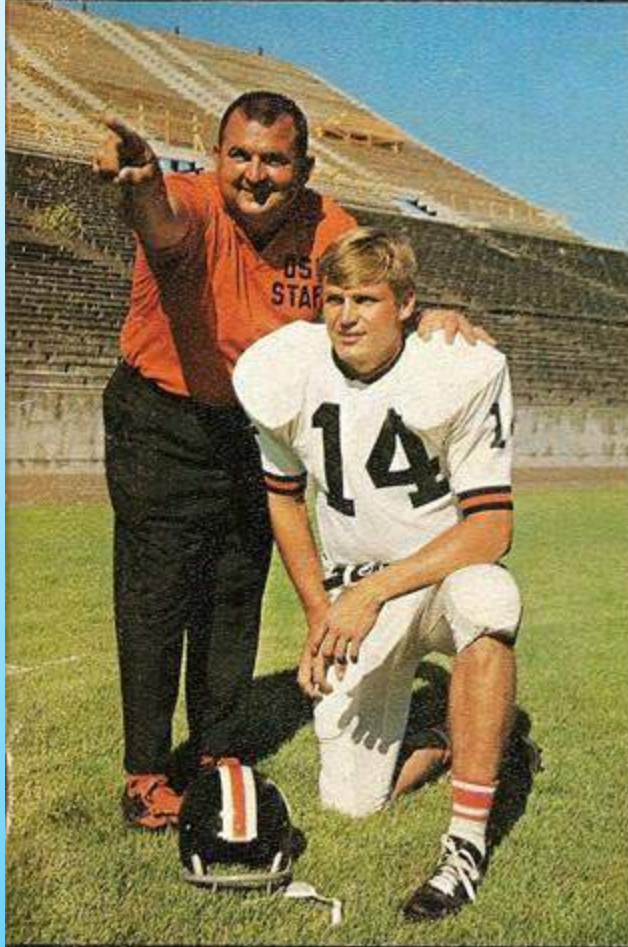
Football: Starting QB (runner-up to

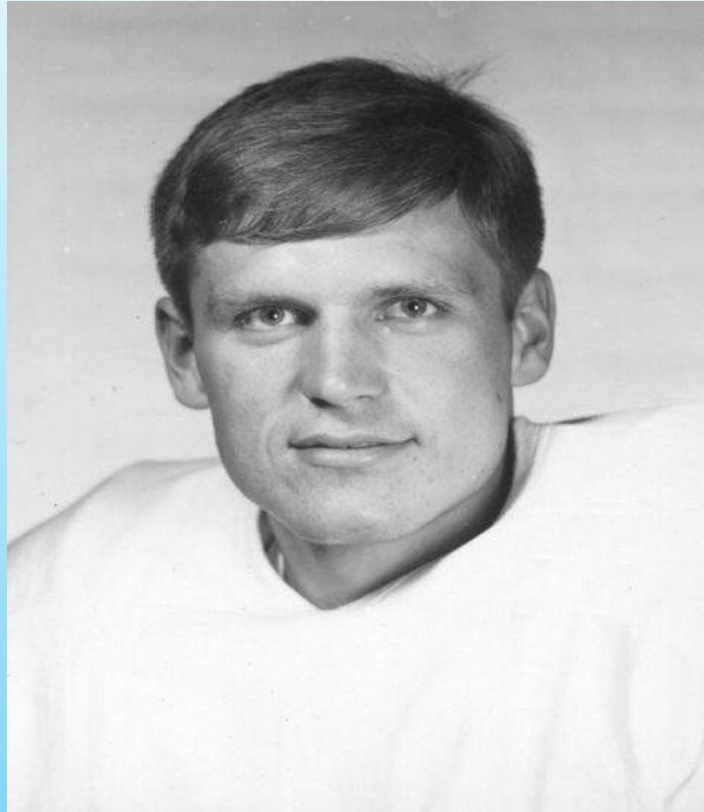
