



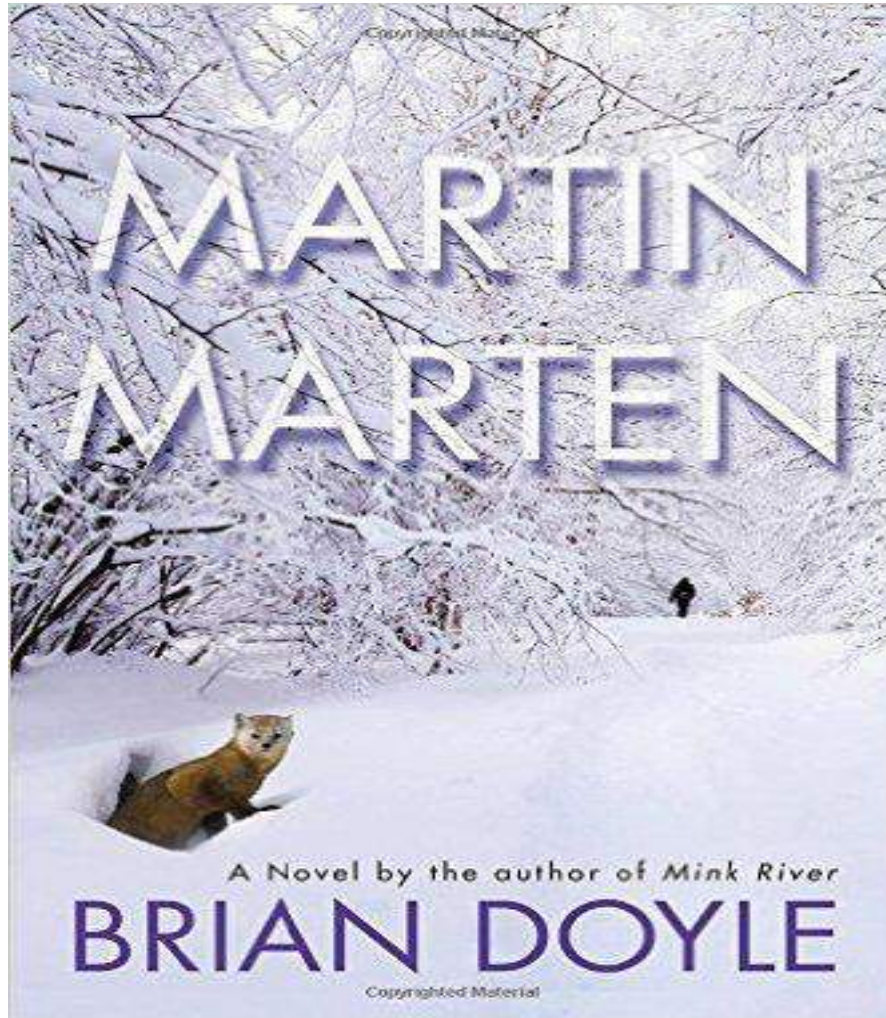

# Rotary Club Traditions

---

Rotary Clubs around the world have different club traditions that become common by region or even globally. This wiki page is to document some of those traditions.

## Meeting Traditions

---

- **"Happy Dollars"** - During meetings, clubs who run Happy Dollars will have a set portion in their meeting (usually in the beginning) dedicated to happy dollars. During this time, Rotarians can donate a dollar (or multiple dollars) and tell the club what they are happy about. It works as a positive reinforcement for members to want to share positive events in their life, while giving back to either the club treasury, the Rotary Foundation, or a club designated charity. The reverse of happy dollars is fining. (See below) (Happy dollars has been observed widely in Rotary Clubs in the United States.)
- **"Fining"** - During meetings, clubs who run Fines will have a set portion of their meeting (usually in the beginning) dedicated to fining. During this time, a "Fine Master" will call out Rotarians who have celebrated a positive event in their life recently (i.e. anniversaries, birthdays, opening a new business, new car, new child, new grandchild, etc.) and ask them to donate a certain amount to the club treasury or Rotary Foundation in honor of that event. The reverse of fining is happy dollars. (See above) (Fining has been observed widely in Rotary Clubs in the United States.)
- **Four Way Test** - During meetings, clubs who do the [Four Way Test](#) will recite it at the beginning or end of the meeting as a way to remind themselves and each other of the things they say and do.
