Mark Waller was born in New York City in 1950.

After attending high school in New England, he decided to attend Reed College[1968-1970] after a phone interview with Peter Jurney who worked in admissions at Reed at the time.

College years included a focus on political science, time in the merchant marine, working as a mountain guide in the Sierras, Wind Rivers and Sawtooths and some acting adventures in New York and Europe.

After a winter of sitting practice at a Tibetan Buddhist retreat center in the Colorado Rockies, Mark started a gift and precious jewelry business with his ex-wife Claire and lived in Bandon during the 70's.

Mark started BridgeWorks Capital in 1985. BridgeWorks focuses on financing, growing and supporting venture to mid stage enterprises. Companies have included technology platforms licensed from National Labs, and many companies focused on software, medical devices, natural resource and clean technology. In the last decade, BridgeWorks has raised @ 500MM to build solar manufacturing businesses---two were listed on NASDAQ and PrimeStar Solar, which Mark co-founded in 2006, was chosen as the General Electric Company's solar manufacturing platform in 2007. Mark served as a Director from inception until the ultimate sale to GE in 2011 and as Chairman for two years. PrimeStar GE participated in the global race for improved efficiency and lower cost energy and held world records for thin film, Cadmium Telluride solar panel efficiency multiple times.

In Rotary, Mark cofounded the Portland Metro Rotary, served as its second President and served District 5100 for two years as Membership Chair. In @ 2000, Mark transferred to LO Rotary. He has served our club twice on the Board, as Sergeant at Arms, and as the first and current Chair of the Peacebuilder Committee.

In the community, Mark served/serves on the boards of the National College of Natural Medicine[terms as Vice Chair and Chair, helped start the research department], The NW Tibetan Cultural Assoc[co-hosted Dalai Lama's PDX visit in 2001], Friends of the Columbia Gorge, Clackamas Women's Services, Self Enhancement Inc, Oregon Environmental Council, Portland Habitat[past Board Chair, initiated a 12MM successful Capital Campaign], Maitripa College[co-hosted another PDX visit by the Dalai Lama in 2013], Kiddazzle Dental Services......and has been an active member of the Mt Hood Ski Patrol for the last 12 years.

Mark lives in Lake Oswego with his partner Gai[huge thanks to many in this club who assisted in Gail's recovery from a car/bike accident last August] and an Aussie named Jake. His daughter, Sarah, works in the TV and movie business in Los Angeles.

- Mark climbed all of the Three Sisters in one day, solo.
- Mark hosted Senator Obama when he first visited Portland in the 2008 election year and then served on the incoming administration's Clean Tech Advisory Group which advised Obama's team on climate change policy priorities.

PEACE FELLOWSHIPS





WHAT ARE ROTARY PEACE FELLOWSHIPS?

Each year, Rotary selects up to 100 individuals from around the world to receive fully funded academic fellowships at one of our peace centers. These fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses.

In just over a decade, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 900 fellows for careers in peace building. Many of them go on to serve as leaders in national governments, NGOs, the military, law enforcement, and international organizations like the United Nations and World Bank.

Rotary.org – Peace Fellowship

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The Rotary Peace Fellowship is designed for professionals with work experience in international relations or peace and conflict prevention and resolution. Our fellows are committed to community and international service and the pursuit of peace.
- Applicants must also meet the following requirements:
- Proficiency in English; proficiency in a second language is strongly recommended
- Strong commitment to international understanding and peace as demonstrated through professional and academic achievements and personal or community service
- Excellent leadership skills
- Master's degree applicants: minimum three years of related full-time work or volunteer experience, bachelor's degree
- Certificate applicants: minimum five years of related full-time work or volunteer experience, strong academic background

ELIGIBILITY RESTRICTIONS

- Rotary Peace Fellowships may not be used for doctoral study. And the following people are not eligible for the master's degree program:
- Active and honorary Rotary members
- Employees of a Rotary club or district, Rotary International, or other Rotary entity
- Spouses, lineal descendants (children or grandchildren by blood or legal adoption), spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parents or grandparents by blood) of any living person in these categories
- Former Rotary members and their relatives as described above (within 36 months of their resignation)
- Recipients of Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarships or professional development certificate fellowships must wait three years after completion of the scholarship or fellowship to apply for the master's degree program.
- Rotary Peace Fellows who have completed the master's degree program must wait five years to apply for the certificate program.




