

The **Klickitat County Broadband Action Team (KCBAT**), a collaborative group of stakeholders that <u>meet monthly to address the presence and quality of broadband internet service in Klickitat County</u>.



While the KCBAT is a new group (formed in March 2023), I believe in the importance of acknowledging that KCBAT is simply a name given to efforts that have been ongoing for at least 20 years. Through research I have learned about the incredible people who initiated and continue to shed light on the lack of internet service provided to communities throughout Klickitat County. It was through my research that I became motivated to "grab the relay baton", recognize the efforts of community members before me, like Dan Spatz, and continue their efforts to the extent that I am able. As I have no doubt you have experienced through your community efforts, the real challenge was getting the right people to the same table at the same time. So far our efforts have led to the creation of the KCBAT, also the KC Board of County Commissioners unanimously voting to officially request a broadband feasibility study through the WA State Department of Commerce, and a countywide communication initiative about the importance of every Klickitat resident taking the WA broadband speed survey (postcard attached).

Dan and I are scheduled to provide further information in-person to the Rotary Club in August.

In the interim, if the Rotary Club is interested in KCBAT efforts, we invite representatives to attend the next meeting on Thursday, 25 May 2023, 1-2PM at the Goldendale Library (Zoom option available). Our point-of-contact for the meeting is Carrie Pipinich at the Mid-Columbia Economic Development District (MCEDD) who can be reached via email at carrie@mcedd.org.
