For those who have been to our Festival of Wreaths and Wine Fundraiser at the Battle Ground Community Center, you may know that ShelterBox is an organization supported by BGRC that delivers a "shelter box" to those in need during an emergency. By providing emergency shelter, tools, and household supplies to displaced families after disaster, ShelterBox enables families to begin to rebuild and recover, transforming despair into hope. Our club was introduced to ShelterBox by Mike Robinson from our sister club, Lewis River Rotary. For the past 8 years our club has funded at least one box and often two boxes. These boxes are deployed by teams of



volunteers who respond to humanitarian crises around the world. Sadly, Mike passed recently and will be greatly missed. He was a champion for those in need and always had a smile. BGRC's commitment to ShelterBox and their mission remains strong.
