FROM YOUR CLUB TREASURER

For members with questions about your quarterly invoices, payment methods, or curiosity about the process of billing, here's your chance to get some of them answered.

- Member dues are billed four times a year within a week at the start of each quarter. The invoices are generated in QuickBooks, and are based on the current rate set by the board of directors. Dues are now \$190/quarter and include per-member rates for Rotary International and D5110 dues in addition to club dues and weekly meals.
- Other charges may appear on your invoice that affect that total. These would mostly be IOU's charged sometime the previous quarter. For this billing period July - September 2023, charges to your club member account would be from April-June activity. Any questions about your IOU charges are best handled early in the billing process.
- Members can also set up quarterly or annual donations to The Rotary Foundation (TRF) Annual Polio Plus funds, or our Redmond Rotary Charitable Corporation (RRCC) that supports our scholarship program.
- Invoices are sent out through our email account as a pdf attachment. The subject line should include "Redmond Rotary", the guarter for which the invoice is due, and the Invoice #. The quarter is identified by which calendar quarter is being billed, the letter "Q" and the calendar year.
- Members may pay by check or credit card. I even get the occasional cash payment! If your preferred method of payment is known to me, the memo on the invoice will reflect that preference. If you don't wish to keep a credit card on file in our Square system, I can usually run your card at any weekly meeting I attend. At this time, we cannot process Zelle, Venmo or other types of digital payment.
- This quarter, I am requesting replies (just to me at the Rotary email please) when you receive your invoice. Let me know if your email address is the preferred address to use, whether there was an attachment or if you had issues opening the document.


In future communications, I will share details on our club dues assistance program and other aspects of why being a Redmond Rotarian is so great.
