

Rotary Craft Talk Outline

1. Introduction (1 min)

- Greet the audience warmly.
 - Thank the club and briefly explain what a craft talk is for those unfamiliar.
 - State your name, profession, and Rotary club affiliation.
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2. Personal Background (2 mins)

- Where you're from / grew up
 - A little about your family, upbringing, or key influences
 - Any defining personal stories or milestones
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3. Professional Life (2–3 mins)

- What you do (or did, if retired)
 - Your career path – how you got started, major shifts, highlights
 - Challenges or lessons you've learned along the way
 - Anything quirky or unexpected about your profession?
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4. Community Involvement (1–2 mins)

- Volunteer work or civic involvement outside of Rotary
 - Causes you care about
 - A story about a moment that inspired you to give back
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5. Your Rotary Journey (1–2 mins)

- How and why you joined Rotary
 - What it's meant to you so far
 - A project or moment that's stood out
 - What you hope to contribute going forward
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6. Closing (30 sec)

- Thank the audience again
 - Invite others to connect with you afterward
 - Optional: Share a favorite quote or life motto
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Bonus Tips:

- Use visuals or props if you're comfortable (a photo, item from your work, etc.)
- Keep it light, authentic, and personal—it's all about connection!
- Practice to stay within the time limit, but don't worry about being perfect.
