## **Berkeley Symphony Thrives**

Tiffany Fajardo, the Berkeley Symphony Engagement Manager, presented an enlightening overview of the Berkeley Symphony at last week's Berkeley Rotary Club meeting. Her talk began with a deep dive into the Symphony's history, enriched by a letter from its president. She highlighted the Symphony's early recordings, which



played a pivotal role in the community's development, notably mentioning a significant collaboration with Frank Zappa.

Fajardo then detailed the Symphony's evolution under Joana Carneiro's leadership, who gained national recognition for inviting high-caliber soloists to perform. This growth trajectory set the stage for the current music director, Joseph Young. Young's innovative strategies during the pandemic lockdown, such as bringing performances into patrons' homes and collaborating with the Berkeley Public Library for the "Reading Is Instrumental" program, were particularly noteworthy. These efforts, coupled with four other innovative collaborations, helped the Symphony thrive amid challenging times.

The presentation emphasized the Berkeley Symphony's commitment to community engagement. Its key objectives include introducing local students to music, fostering oneon-one experiences with world-class musicians, and partnering with like-minded organizations to create holistic musical experiences. These initiatives ensure the Symphony's continued emphasis on quality, a defining characteristic for nearly five decades.

In 2024, the Berkeley Symphony is set to undertake several initiatives, including programs in local schools, literary soundscapes, and a rendition of "Pictures at an Exhibition." Fajardo's presentation effectively communicated the Symphony's role in enriching Berkeley's cultural landscape, catering to both music enthusiasts and accomplished artists.
