PolioPlus Update for 2023

For several years, I've provided PolioPlus updates for the club, getting the data myself from international sources. Our District PolioPlus committee is now providing regular updates from RI. Here's the most recent.

We are holding at 12 cases of wild polio. That's for all of 2023 and through January 10[,] 2024 : 6 in Afghanistan, 6 in Pakistan. This was long the dominant concern of PolioPlus. We remain "This Close" to winning that long war. It's become a major public health priority in both countries now.

On the other front, **circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus (cVDPV)** cases totaled 491 in 2023 (compared with 668 for the same period in 2022). We do many millions of vaccinations each year, increasing with vaccinations no longer using live virus. But for the countries still using the old vaccines, new cases can occur.

Report from Recent RI Board Meeting

Every two months or so, as a past District Governor, I get to attend a briefing by the West Coast representative to the RI Board on the most recent Board meeting. Items of note from last weekâ \in TMs briefing include:</sup>

- San Francisco's bid for the 2029 RI convention was rejected, although it was one of two finalists. Minneapolis was selected, even though the 2030 convention will be in Chicago for the 125th anniversary of Rotary's founding
- The key goal set by the incoming RI President for the 2024-25 year is that each District achieve 5 new clubs or 100 new members.
- There are increasing requests from United Nations organizations, the World Health Organization, and world disaster areas for Rotary help. We're already a central part of that planning, but each dollar donated to the RI Foundation makes it possible for RI to respond.
- An elaborate long-range strategic planning is again under way but is making little progress. The goal is to build from the bottom up, with input coming from Districts and clubs. My advice: Don't hold your breath. RI and Districts are aware that most clubs don't take the setting of their annual goals that seriously.
