

## **Building Goodwill and Better Friendships**

Last Wednesday, our club's Past Presidents reviewed several of our key service projects over the past 20 years. Ed Church (2004-05), with help from Beth Roessner (2018-19), led us on a trip down memory lane with highlights of a number of important and long-lasting projects, local and international, from 2000 to 2023: The Dictionary Project; parking at the annual kite festival; Shorebird Park renovation; projects in Nayarit, Mexico; and the rehabilitation of Warren Easton High School in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina.



Inspired by Larry Goldenberg (2003-04), the Dictionary Project began in 2003. Under the remarkable leadership of Pamela Doolan, Berkeley Rotary supplied every  $3^{\rm rd}$  grader in the Berkeley public schools with a personal dictionary each year until 2020, when the pandemic closed it down.
