The Berkeley Relief Fund

Club member John Caner who serves as the CEO of the Downtown Berkeley Association, along with Berkeley Mayor Jesse Arregu and the Mayor s Chief of Staff Jacquelyn McCormick, presented a program about the Berkeley Relief Fund to the club on April 1. The Berkeley Relief Fund was recently established by the city, working in conjunction with the Downtown Berkeley Association, Berkeley Chamber, and many other groups and individuals, to provide emergency relief grants to local small businesses, nonprofit arts organizations, and residential tenants that are hardest hit by the COVID-19 pandemic. The City Council approved \$3 million in funds for the program and are looking to the greater community to match this amount. The Berkeley

Rotary Club has stepped up to provide \$5,000, and thus far \$681,000 has been raised by the community. It is anticipated that additional fundraising efforts will be necessary as the shutdowns continue and we look to future recovery.

John, Mayor Arregu In, and Ms. McCormick described how the fund got started and all the groups that have been involved in this critical effort to keep our small businesses afloat. John introduced us to the website at https://berkeleyrelieffund.org/ and showed some moving short videos from local businesses about their struggles during the COVID-19 shut-down and why the relief fund is important at this time. There are dozens of these heartfelt YouTube videos linked on the website and they are well worth watching. The presenters urged Rotary members to spread the word about the Relief Fund and help to promote its success using the materials provided on the website.
