- FOOD: \$25 for an authentic German lunch



The Challenges of Civil Discourse

Engagement, shared fascinating insights into the challenges of promoting civil dialogue—on campus, in our community, and in Congress. Lindheim has a unique perspective, having served as senior advisor to Congressman Ron Dellums, as Oakland's City Manager during a time of violent protests following the shooting of Oscar Grant, and in his current role, which includes advising the Chancellor on how to ensure safe and orderly free speech on campus.

Lindheim described how Congressman Ron Dellums won the respect of his congressional colleagues whose political views were opposite of his own by listening to their concerns and giving an honest, non-confrontational presentation of his position. In one instance, it resulted in a co-sponsored bill by Dellums and John Kasich to roll

back the B-52 bomber program.

As Oakland City Manager, Lindheim worked closely with the police department to promote peaceful protest after the BART police shooting of Oscar Grant. He pointed out that the protests were generally peaceful and orderly until 9:00 pm or so, when Black Bloc anarchists would begin breaking windows and attacking the police. This is a pattern that has occurred in many local demonstrations.
