The Sky's The Limit

At last week's meeting Berkeley Rotary welcomed Cindy Dickeson, MSW, Executive Director of the Center for Early Intervention on Blindness (CEID). Cindy spoke about maximizing communication potential for children and adults who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Cindy's presentation was lively and she is clearly passionate about her work. She shared that she came to this work many years ago as an outgrowth of her desire to learn how to communicate more effectively with her deaf four-year-old stepson.

Cindy mentioned that the CEID began initially as a federal pilot project, and according to its website: "Since 1980, the Center for Early Intervention on Deafness (CEID) has provided exemplary services for young



children, from birth to age 5, who are deaf, hard of hearing or who have severe speech and language delays.

To achieve our goal of maximizing communication potentials, we offer comprehensive programs in early education in combination with extensive therapy (language, speech, auditory, occupational, and physical therapies), home visits, and family education and support. Our community audiology services round out our center offering comprehensive audiology services to children and adults in 24 counties. Our highly qualified staff members hold Master's degrees in deaf education, speech therapy, occupational therapy, social work, and infant mental health. We also work closely with two expert consultants: a neurodevelopmental pediatrician and a clinical psychologist."
