Peace Grove Celebration 2024

Last week's Peace Grove Celebration was an astounding success. This year's recipient of the RI Peace Grove Award was the Ukrainian Center for Civil Liberties (UCCL). As always, a tree in the Grove was dedicated to the recipient. Peace Committee Co-Chair Dan Thomas organized the event and initiated it with the accustomed bell-ring and group recital of the Four-Way Test. He then thanked our distinguished guests: Dan Geraldi (current District 5160 Governor), Suzanne Bragdon (past District 5160 Governor and Rotary Positive Peace Activator for North America and the Caribbean), and Dmytro Kushneruk (Consul General of Ukraine in San Francisco, who accepted the ceremonial plaque for UCCL). We welcomed Elizabeth Echols, President of the East Bay Parks Regional District, for her first appearance at our annual ceremony.

For the first time in 13 years, the event took place in the Brazilian Room in Tilden Park, with BRC President Ken Renworth and David Pooke transmitting live from the Grove. Volodymyr Goshylyk invited the Consul General, managed ticketing, and more. We feasted on Ukrainian food from Leleka in San Francisco and Ukrainian rugelach from Outbaking in Berkeley. Anne Pardee arranged the catering and also delivered a moving tribute to the UCCL. Co-Chair Maxim Schrogin spoke about Rotary's commitment to peace and our club's extensive work in that area. Fred Collignon talked informatively about the history of the Grove. Members of the Peace Committee led those in the room and on Zoom in the recital of the Peace Grove Liturgy, which ended this year's moving ceremony. Dan Thomas was thanked for the outstanding job he did on organizing the event.


Wanted: A Living Room (Sort of) Near Campus!


