On October 3rd, Berkeley Rotary Club members heard an important presentation by Ruben Canedo, the Research and Mobilization Coordinator for UC Berkeley's Center for Educational Equity and Excellence (CE3). Born in the United States, Canedo grew up in

communities straddling the US/Mexico border: the Imperial and Coachella valleys and Mexicali, Mexico. As a first generation college student at UC Berkeley, he was acutely aware of the inequities facing students living in one of the most expensive regions in the country – especially in terms of affordable housing and food access. Canedo began work with CE3 in 2013 identifying barriers to access at UC Berkeley. UC Berkeley's Basic Needs Committee

was the first institutional committee in the nation to work on questions involving intersectionality, systems change, and innovation.

Canedo helped club members understand the larger context of the challenge. Today's college students have a totally different economic reality than previous students. The total cost of attendance at a college or university equals tuition plus the cost of living. Declining federal contributions to institutions of higher learning has led to much higher tuition costs, and the astronomical price of housing and food has resulted in widespread food and housing insecurity.
