We don't want you to miss the fun - it will be de-lightful, de-licious, de-lovely.


Dick Erickson, BRC Past President, Obituary

The following was published in the San Francisco Chronicle on November 11, 2018. Dick was a Past President of Berkeley Rotary (1992-93).

Richard E. (Dick) Erickson, a loving husband, father, and grandfather, died peacefully on Monday, October 15th, 2018.

Dick grew up in Stockton, California alongside his two beloved brothers, Paul and John. As a member of the Navy's V-12 college training program, he attended John Carroll University as well as the <u>University of Michigan</u> where he met his future wife, Jan. Dick graduated (BS, MBA) from the University of California at Berkeley – where he played quarterback for the Cal Bears, leading them to the 1949 Rose Bowl. Dick and Jan lived in Kensington and El Cerrito prior to moving to Rossmoor. Most recently, Dick has been residing at The Carnelian in Walnut Creek. Dick Erickson spent the majority of his working life on the campus of his beloved CAL. First as the third Executive Director of the California Alumni Association, where he served for 16 years. Then as the first Assistant Chancellor for Development. In appreciation of his service to the University Dick was the recipient of the Glenn Seaborg Award, the Berkeley Citation and the UC Berkeley Foundation Award. Dick was also one of the founding members and the Executive Director of Pappy's Boys, which exists to support CAL football, and was inducted into the Stockton Sports Hall of Fame. Giving back to his community was also important to Dick as evidenced by his memberships in the Berkeley <u>Rotary Club</u>, the Berkeley Breakfast Club, the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame, and the Bay Area Sports Hall of Fame. Supporting College and Career Success for ALL Berkeley Students

On November 14, 2018, Rotarians received an informative presentation on The Berkeley Promise, a college access and matriculation scholarship initiative designed to help Berkeley Unified School District (BUSD) graduates particularly those who are firstgeneration-to-college, from lower income families or from underrepresented groups—advance on a path to complete a post-secondary degree or certificate, that starts with

community college. Students receive mentoring, academic guidance, financial assistance, and transfer support while enrolled at Berkeley City College (BCC).

Martin de Mucha Flores, BCC Associate Dean and Joleen Ruffin, Executive Director of the Berkeley Community Fund, shared BUSD data on students who graduated in 2010. Less than a quarter of economically disadvantaged students had completed a degree within six years compared with over 50% of students who had parental or other financial support. Only 14% of African American students and 33% of Latino students completed a degree in six years, compared to 68% of white students. Lack of economic and other support play a major role in these disparate rates of completion. Read More
