The Trinity Center has a program that offers Outreach and Respite for Homeless People and the Working Poor. Every day Trinity Center offers hope to people who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. At Trinity Center hope takes the form of positive action by serving meals, providing showers, laundry facilities, clothing, a food pantry, referrals for housing, mental/physical health services, substance use counseling, jobs and job training, as well as access to mail and phone services. They depend on volunteers to help them offer hope and opportunity. Staff members post job opportunities and assist with locating County resources that address addiction and other challenges. Clients are connected to ongoing benefits such as Medicaid, TANF, SSI/SSDI, Covered CA Health Care, and Food Stamps. The fellowship of sharing meals and helping others similarly distressed are the softer side of this vibrant program. Trinity Center is a safe place to be off the street.
