Each year the Food Bank distributes 25 million pounds of food to over one hundred thousand families. The amount donated by us will provide five thousand meals. By Laws


Secretary Fred Nelson reviewed the By Law changes and asked that a motion be made to officially change them.

Also Fred explained that Directors were elected to serve two year terms. Now the Directors can serve as long as they like.




The proposed changes and additions passed unanimously.






Irene Davids-Blair thanked Vicki Sexton for serving as the dedicated driver when she and Joan were the passengers on the drive
