In fact, the number of reported cases of children who have been infected has decreased from 350,000 per year down to only two: one in Pakistan and one in Afghanistan thanks to the work of the World Health Organization, UNICEF, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Center for Disease Control, Gavi Vaccine Alliance, and the donations by Rotarians all over the world.




The PolioPlus Society

FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE WILL MEET 10/16













"Good!" replied the trainee, and put down the phone.


REMEMBER PHYLLIS DILLER?
