





TODAY'S SPEAKER





Program Chair Miles Bell introduced us to **Joey Fernandez**, the Executive Director of the Diablo Golf Course who spoke to us about the golf club, but also introduced us to an outstanding program called the First Tee of Contra Costa County. The First Tee is a year-round youth program established to teach life skills and instill core values through the game of golf for boys and girls. The program consists of golf skills, games and challenges, life skills education, golf etiquette, and green fee discounts through the NCGA "Youth on Course" program at Diablo Creek Golf Course. Ninety-seven percent of the kids who participate in this program go on to college.

The intent of this program is to provide a fun and safe learning environment for children interested in golf, regardless of financial ability. The program inspires children to enjoy this great game, while they learn social skills and values such as patience, courtesy, honesty and fairness. The First Tee of Contra Costa's Life/Golf Skills Experience is a youth development program for boys and girls ages 5-18. Kids learn about golf and the skills and values inherent in the game. Participants who are in grades 2 through 12 starts at the PLAYer level and then progress through Par, Birdie, and Eagle levels. Target classes are available to participants in grades K-1, Eagle and Birdie level participants are encouraged to coach the Target, PLAYer, and Par level classes. Class sizes are limited, so sign up early to secure your spot in class.

The East Bay Golf Foundation is a youth charity program at Diablo Creek Golf Course. Diablo Creek Golf Course has been approved to be the site for The First Tee of Contra Costa which is an initiative of the World Golf Foundation. They have an enrollment of 1,100 kids participating. 
HAPPY BUCKS


