



TODAY'S SPEAKER

PROTECTING THE PUBLIC FOR 95 YEARS

Today's speaker, Andrew Pierce, Public Information and Technology Officer with the Contra



Costa Mosquito & Vector Control District, gave us valuable information about what the public health agency does to protect county residents from mosquitoes, rats and mice, skunks, ground-nesting yellowjackets, and ticks. He told us what we can do to protect ourselves, the services the District provides at no additional charges, and how we can partner with the District to protect public health.

Andrew proceeded to tell us that the District is dedicated to the health and welfare of the county's more than 1 million residents covering 736 square miles. In fact, we've been protecting public health since 1927 when residents formed the District. Funded

through tax dollars, the District offers free services for mosquitoes, rats and mice, ground-nesting yellow jackets, ticks, and skunks. Our trained and certified employees work daily to reduce the risk of diseases spread by insects and animals by controlling them in a responsible, environmentally conscious manner. It's all part of our Integrated Vector Management program where we use the most efficient and effective state-of-the-art protocols and products. All products are registered with the Environmental Protection Agency. In answer to a member's question, Andrew said: "No, they don't do Racoons."


HAPPYBUCKS


