Deb and Herb report: We had some highlights for the meeting, and they were as follows:

IMMUNIZATION: We had a mass polio immunization throughout the country sponsored by Rotary International. The clinic staff carried out a door-to-door immunization in the community.

SOLAR LIGHTING: The Rotary club of Durango High noon in Colorado USA sponsored the solar lighting for both the maternity and pediatric wards. Therefore, the utility bills on electricity have so far been reduced and we now have reliable lighting.

NEWBORNS: There was a delivery of a baby girl on 1st January 2023 born to a 16-year-old mother. The prevalence of child mothers is on the rise especially after many students dropped out of school after the Covid lock down and the current economic situation where school fees is a challenge to many families. The clinic is, therefore, going to emphasize sensitization of the young mothers on the advantages of family planning with support from Reproductive Health Uganda and the Uganda Government.


**Dr. Torsten Jacobsen** responded that people should be aware that good posture is essential to keeping lungs healthy. So, straighten up Joan.
