

HEALTH ADVICE TO FOLLOW: For Your Own Sake

Torsten Jacobsen wants us to keep in mind that in four out of five people who have a stroke, their first symptom is a stroke! The good news is that 80% of strokes and heart disease can be prevented. What is your lipid panel? What is your weight? What is your blood pressure? Do you know? You MUST know to control your health. Decrease weight, change diet, increase aerobic exercise. Get tested: Ultrasound screening is inexpensive (\$300+). Carotid artery disease (two major vessels that deliver blood to the brain) test can check for plaques as well as for aortic aneurysm which can be life-threatening, and EKG can check for atrial fibrillation which can cause blood clots. So much is in our own hands and helped by modern technology.
