"**Break a leg**" is a typical English idiom used in the context of theatre or other performing arts to wish a performer "good luck" and is commonly said to actors before they go on stage. One theory as to how it started in the theatre was the way understudies would sit in the back row politely hoping the various principals would break a leg. That way, they'd get to act the part instead. Little did any of us think that we were going to be performing at today's meeting. Thanks to our guest speaker, **Kenn Adams** the Artistic Director of Synergy Theater, that's precisely what happened. After a thorough history of improvisation, he got us all to take part on a totally entertaining series of improve skits.

FIELDTRIP: Kenn Adams

Today's speaker, **Kenn Adams**, is the Artistic Director of **Synergy Theater** and the author of the book "How to Improvise a Full-Length Play; The Art of Spontaneous Theater." He is the creator of the classic short form improv games Sit, Stand and Kneel and The Family Dinner (a.k.a. Ding/Buzz or Biography) as well as The Story Spine, a simple exercise for understanding story structure that has been embraced by improvisers, writers, and teachers the world over.

Kenn began his career in New York City with Freestyle Repertory Theater, the New York Home for TheatreSports, and has been performing, directing, and teaching improvisation for 30 years. In addition, Kenn uses the practice of applied improvisation to design and facilitate organizational development curriculum in the areas of leadership development, creativity, and innovation.
