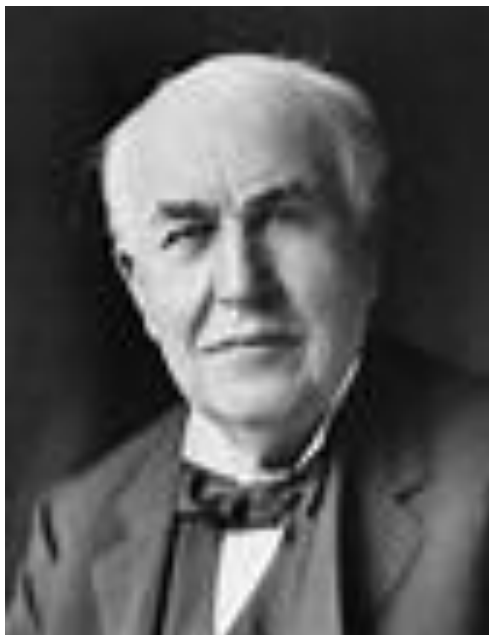

TODAY'S SPEAKERS

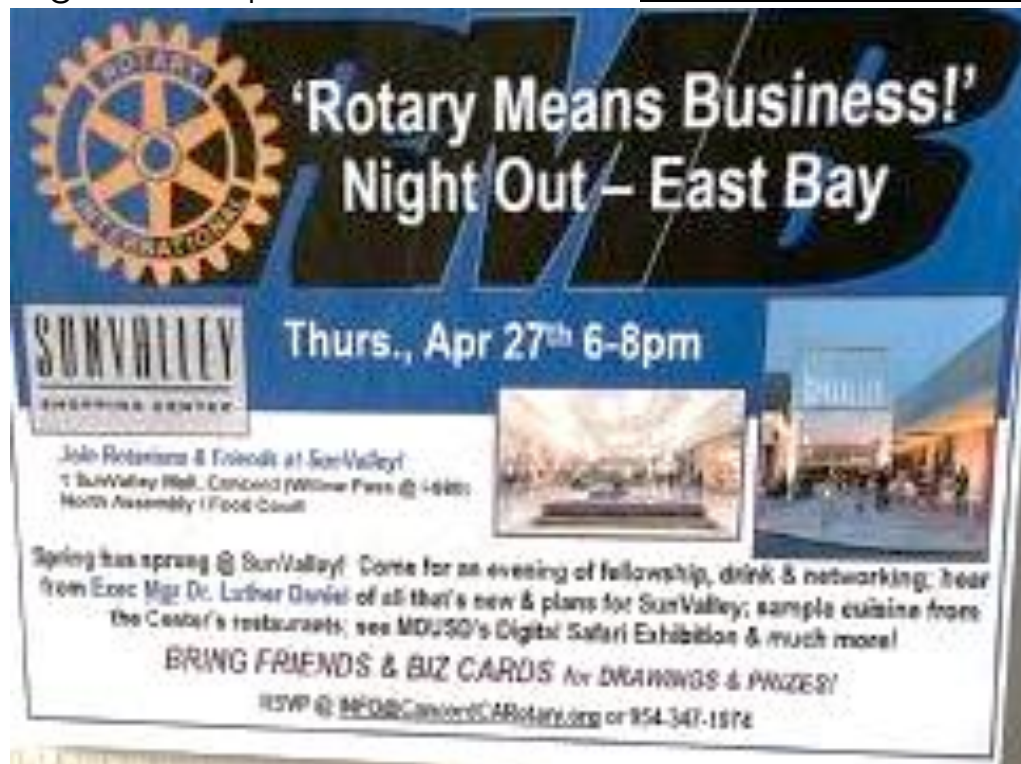
There were many speakers this morning so let's start with Dave Litty:

Dave invited us to join them for an evening of fun and networking at the Sun Valley Shopping Center April 27 from 6 to 8 PM. Info@concordCARotary.org



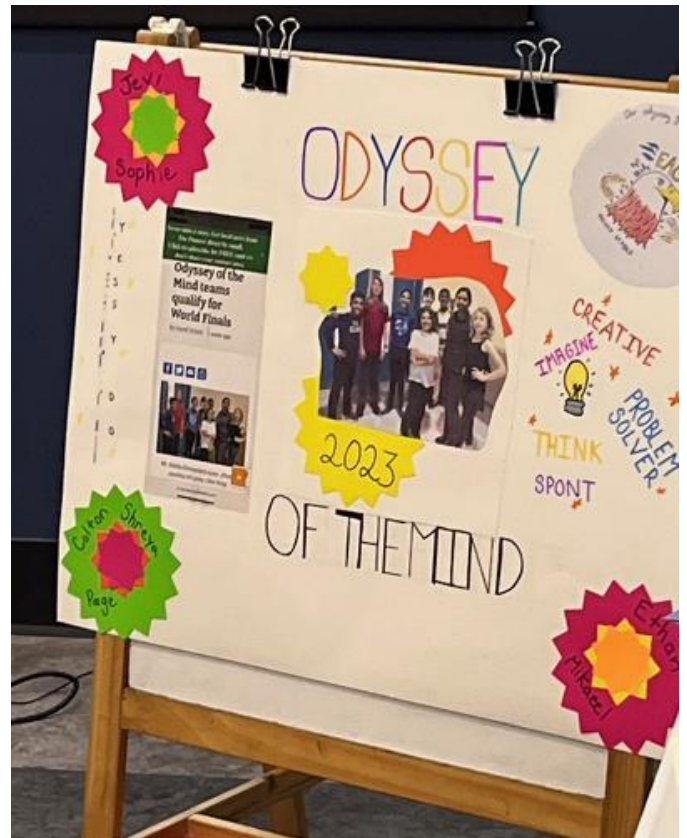
ODYSSEY OF THE MIND

These are the members who showed up for a much-needed task last week. Mary sure was having a good time. Maybe because Dave attended.

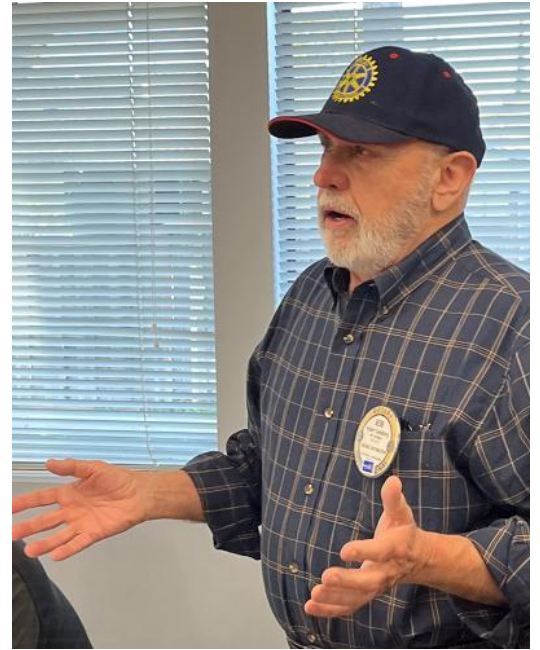


HAPPYBUCKS
