The 5160 **District Governor, Claire Roberts**, joined us today and brought us up to speed on the goals for 2023-2024. The list includes promoting peace, empowering girls, focusing on DEI, polio eradication, and on mental health issues. It is a monumental program but if anyone is up to the task, Claire Roberts is.

Just who is Clair Roberts?

Claire is a serial volunteer. Throughout her life she has volunteered for non-profits including local and national organizations. Claire served as the Board President of the

Orinda Association, led the effort to expand services to include a local volunteer clearing house and to promote business sponsorships for the local 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration.

In college, Claire joined Delta Sigma Pi, a professional business fraternity. She has remained active since graduation and has served on the national Board of Directors and as a Trustee of the Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Foundation. Claire currently serves as the Chair of the fraternity's national Professional Development Committee leading training and professional development programs for collegiate and alumni members. In 2017, Claire was recognized as the first woman to receive the fraternity's Lifetime Achievement award.

Claire joined the Rotary Club of Lamorinda Sunrise in 2012. She served on the Club Board as the chair of the Membership and Communications committees prior to becoming President for the 2016-17 year. Claire was recognized as the Rotarian of the Year for 2013-14. At the district level, Claire has served on the Foundation committee, as general co-Chair of the Rotary 4-Way Fest in 2019, as District Trainer for 2019-2021 and as the Chief of Staff for the 2021-22 District Governor. Claire was recognized as District Rotarian of the Year for 2018-19. Prior to her retirement in September 2021, Claire spent her career in the financial service industry focusing on Risk Management and Compliance.

Claire and her husband, 2020-21 District Governor Mark Roberts live in Danville with their three very pampered cats.





### UGANDA

**Deb Luyiima** reports that "two babies were delivered at the end of last month and one at the beginning of this month--two girls and one boy. All mothers and babies are healthy."

### **CERVICAL CANCER WORLDWIDE:** Torsten Jacobsen Reporting

I was happy after reading the article in the September issue of Rotary magazine "Rotary takes on Cervical Cancer." The article was written by Richard Godfrey a highly regarded surgical oncologist who has done extensive work along with Rotary in Latin America as well as Kenya, Asia, and Nepal. Exciting is a new HPV genetic screening test that allows women to test themselves at home. So, the women do not have to travel, and clinicians only need to screen patients who test positive. Uganda will have an estimated 10,000 new cases per year and Mexico 30,000. Worldwide there are at least 340,000 deaths per year with a high degree of terminal suffering, most in lower income


countries ; one every minute and a half. The equipment is called Ampfire and can also test many other infections. The equipment cost about \$33,000, tests around 2,000 patients, and can fit in a backpack. Women thus caught early can be easily treated in an out-.patient clinic. I have spoken with. Dr Godfrey who is willing to join on a visit to our clinic in San Felipe. Efforts in Kenya have brought great results, so why not also in Uganda. Vaccines for all young girls is also very effective prevention.

### **MAUI DISASTER FUND**

As people of action, we can take immediate action. As we come together to recover and rebuild, we need to support each other. We need to Create Hope for Maui. Through the Rotary District 5000 Foundation, a relief fund has been established. **Foundation President Dave Hamil** and Treasurer **Sharon Amano** will handle all donations. A committee has been organized to find the greatest needs for distribution of monies. A single fund will be the most helpful over time to provide the most significant benefits.
