Pancake Breakfast. Last year we fed over 800 hungry guests, under the leadership pf Bill Selb, Rich Lueck, and Jeff Wilson.

Monument Crisis Center Christmas Holiday Boxes. The annual project that feeds the poor and homeless was under the leadership of Molly Bacigalupo who challenged us to increase the number of boxes from 75 to 175 and we did.

Youth Homes Drive to Thrive Foundation. We made a donation to this foundation that serves the youth, ages 18 – 24, who are struggling to transition to adulthood.

Butterfly Project at Newhall Park Butterfly Garden Renovation brings beauty to our community and exposure to what Rotary can do as a team. Thanks to Community Services Directors Clayton Worsdell and Rich Lueck's we worked to achieve that ideal.

Art in a Box. This project enabled us to work with the Mt Diablo School District Hope Program and distribute art supplies to homeless children. Newsletter Editor Joan D'Onofrio and Webmaster John Wenzel and their team made this possible and applied for a district grant to prepare 500 boxes.

Nsawo Village Maternity and Pediatric Clinic. This was designed and built by Hugh and Flor Toloui. Their creation of this amazing facility is a true labor of love. Herb and Deb, our Uganda members,

update us monthly and alerted us to their recent malaria outbreak. We immediately passed the hat and funded the village's need for mosquito netting.


