

#### PERCENTAGE OF LEADERS OVER THE AGE OF 60\*




Rotary's senior leaders are responsible for appointing members to key leadership positions. Because these positions are appointment-based, those with robust networks have a significant advantage of being named a Rotary leader, regardless of their knowledge or skills.

#### **DISTRICT GOVERNORS**



Many Rotary leadership roles require you to first be a district governor. The amount of responsibility and the time commitment required though leads some members to believe that this role is best suited for those who are retired, which may be why 67% of district governors are over 60 years old.


What steps could we take to make the district governor role more manageable and more appealing to all members?



PERCENTAGE CHANGE FROM 2021 TO 2022

Many Rotary leadership roles require you to first be a district governor. In fact, 87% of members who serve on a committee, as a regional or senior leader, or received a presidential appointment were once district governors. This requirement though limits who can serve a senior leader within the district, region, and organization.


What barriers can we remove that would encourage more women to become Rotary leaders?


