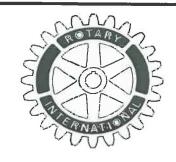

## FIG GARDEN ROTARY FOUNDATION PERMANENT FUND INVESTMENT POLICY

#### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The Board of Directors of Fig Garden Rotary Foundation has the fiduciary responsibility over the Permanent Fund. This responsibility includes providing the philosophy, structure, strategy and direction of the investments in the Permanent Fund.

The Committee shall be prudent, conservative and maintain a primary goal of the preservation of the Permanent Fund investment principal with a secondary goal of optimizing the return on the Permanent Fund.

The goal of the Permanent Fund has been established by the Board of Directors to reach a principal balance of \$250,000. Until the principal balance goal has been met, earnings from the investments in the Permanent Fund shall be reinvested into the Permanent Fund. Upon reaching the \$250,000 goal, the Board of Directors may donate funds for specific programs so long as the principal balance in the Permanent Fund is at least \$250,000.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The Investment Committee has established the following objective for the Fig Garden Rotary Foundation investments in the Permanent Fund:

The objective is to optimize long-term growth of capital commensurate with the needs of the Fig Garden Rotary Foundation. The investment portfolio should maintain asset diversification to meet this objective as well as providing for preservation of principal.

#### PERMISSIBLE INVESTMENTS

The following securities are permissible investments for the Permanent Fund:

- 1. Common stock of any corporation with a rating from ValueLine of 3 or better in both timeliness and safety.
- 2. Mutual funds which are rated by Morningstar to have at least a "3 star" rating. Consideration will also be given to the length of tenure of the fund manager.
- Fixed income vehicles such as corporate bonds with a rating equivalent to grade BBB or better by one of the nationally recognized rating services (i.e., Standard and Poor's or Moody's).
- 4. Bonds, notes, bills or other securities constituting direct obligations of the U.S. government or any federal agency.
- Certificates of deposit or other time deposits not to exceed \$100,000 with any federally insured financial institution. The \$100,000 limit may be exceeded with the Board of Directors' concurrence.
- 6. On a temporary basis, funds may be invested in cash, money market accounts (with banks or

national brokerage firms), or other liquid investments.

#### PORTFOLIO RESTRICTIONS

The following restrictions apply to direct ownership of the Permanent Fund and not indirect investments through mutual funds. Any donations received by the Permanent Fund which violate the following restrictions shall be liquidated as soon as practicable with the proceeds being invested in the Permanent Fund.

1. Investments in equity securities should not exceed 80% of the total fair market value of the Permanent Fund.

The fair market value of the Permanent Fund shall include the unrealized appreciation of any investments in stocks, bonds and other marketable securities. In addition, investments in equity securities shall include the percentage that a mutual fund is invested in equity securities. If the percentage of investments in equity securities for the Permanent Fund portfolio exceeds the 80% limitation, the Investment Committee will inform the Board of Directors at its next semiannual reporting date. The Board of Directors shall provide direction to the Investment Committee as to the appropriateness of the equity securities percentage to the total portfolio.

- No more than 10% of the Permanent Fund may be invested any one corporation's common stock.
- 3. No more than 30% of the Permanent Fund may be invested in any one mutual fund.
- 4. No more than 10% of the Permanent Fund may be directly invested by the Permanent Fund in securities that are not denominated in U.S. dollars.
- 5. "Margin" trading is not permitted.
- 6. Uncovered stock options, commodity futures, and index options are not permitted.

#### TRADING AND EXECUTION GUIDELINES

Although there is a preference toward investing over the long-term, there are no restrictions on portfolio turnover. Executions or trades will seek to achieve a balance between reduction of commissions and "best price".

#### INVESTMENT AUTHORITY

The Board of Directors of the Fig Garden Rotary Foundation will designate investment supervisory powers as follows:

1. The Investment Committee shall approve and direct the Investment Chairperson to initiate investment transactions with a designated brokerage, banking and/or other financial institutions. In the evaluation of which investment to make, when other factors are equal, consideration will be give to institutions that have demonstrated their support to the Fig Garden Rotary Club.

- The Investment Committee shall review at least semiannually the investment performance of the Permanent Fund portfolio as well as discern adherence with the policies and guidelines contained within this document.
- The Investment Committee shall provide to the Board of Directors at least semiannually, May and November, a report on portfolio activity and performance.
- The Investment Committee shall review the Permanent Fund Investment Policy annually and when appropriate propose modifications to said Policy to the Board of Directors of the Fig Garden Rotary Foundation.

All of the foregoing powers and responsibilities may be exercised by a majority of the Investment Committee.

#### PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

To evaluate the effectiveness of the investment program by the Investment Committee, investment performance will be reviewed semiannually, April 30 and October 31, against the guidelines as outlined. It is anticipated that comparison with this standard may not be favorable in any single semiannual period. 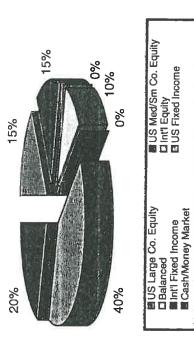

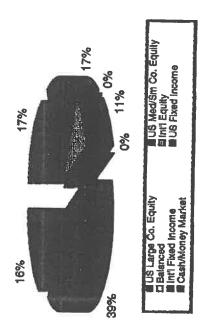

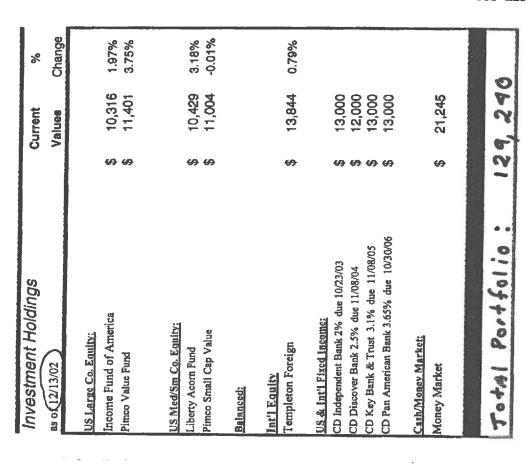
