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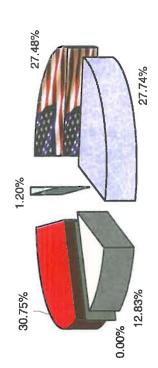

Scott reviewed the Balance Sheet items through 31 January 2004.

One Internet Makeup per quarter will be accepted.

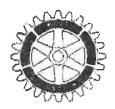

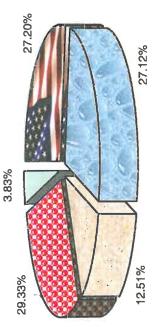

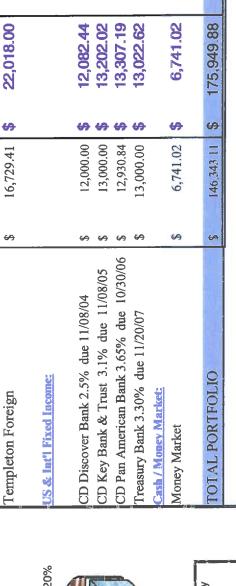

Rod distributed the District Newsletter, reminding Directors and others of the upcoming District Conference. He requested continuing Board Members to attend. At our next meeting, the Board shall approve delegates to this Conference.

Rod reviewed the Avenues Of Service and covered presentation requirements for the Conference.

Regarding the Playland Note Receivable, Greg Baxter wrote (at President Coburn's request) a letter delineating options, which included of course repayment of the \$5,000. note, plus other ideas which included adopting a ride, the latter then necessitating a Club obligation for future maintenance. The Playland Park is financially strapped at this time and cannot repay timely. Forgiveness of the loan is another option.

It was MSC that Fig Garden Rotary Club wait until the end of this season (October/November) for repayment and at that time readdress other options when Playland has the ability to repay.

*AVENUES OF SERVICE:

Club Service:

(August Hioco and Steve Wilson)

The Directors reviewed earlier months' activities, including Fresno State Baeketball Game, Roger Rocka's and noted this month's activity is the Spring Auction on 27 March. The District Conference is April 23-24, and we will have a time at the Zoo on 15 May. The Demotion Celebration is 25 June and the Mystery Dinner will take place during the next Rotary year.

Richard Saroyan led a discussion regarding Our Centennial Project at Bullard High School, the central focus of which is a sound system. A quote from Speeda Sound, Inc. was presented, in the sum of \$24,805.31. A request for a competitive bid was discussed, possibly from Lite Line Productions of Fresno. Approved from unusued funds from budget is an additional \$4,805.31 to cover any shortfall should Speeda Sound receive the contract.

Club Service, Continued:

It was MSC to approve this total funding request, contingent upon naming requirements and verification by a third party as to the total costs being acceptable. A final contract review, of course, is to be done prior to any agreement. A question regarding activities in the Theater was raised, possibly negatively reflecting on the Club should problem-causing issues come forth.

Per Jim Rodgers' submittal, it was MSC to approve the amount of \$1,500. as a Sponsor for Special Olympics.

It was MSC to approve the sum of \$500. for each campus, Bullard High School and San Joaquin Memorial High School, for Sober Grad Night, per Past President John Skewes' request.

Per member Don Beauregard, it was MSC to approve the sum of \$475. for the "Saving Strokes" Program -- the American Stroke Association.

Per member Lucy Ollivier, it was MSC to approve \$500. for Sponsorship of the Annual Awards for the Fresno-Madera Area Agency On Aging.

International Service: (Howard Reed and Mike Graves)

Howard made a report on the trip recently to Ecuador, which provided hugely successful results. Some 200 projets were presented for possible Fig Garden Rotary Club participation, one of which will be a Safe Drinking Water Program for children at schools. It costs approximately \$2,500 per school to do the program. Rotary International will match one-for-one. It was MSC to provide the sum of \$5,000 which, when matched, will take care of four schools.

Vocational Service: (Matt Merzoian)

The Committee has forwarded requests for Scholarship Applicants to the appropriate campuses. The Committee shall decide nominees. Matt will coordinate with President Rod as to when the Scholarships shall be presented, with a target for May.

Camp Royal is scheduled for 18 June, with our Club cooking and Kurt Zumwalt coordinating.

*OLD BUSINESS:

No Old Business this meeting. The Playland Note issue was covered under "President's Time."

*NEW BUSINESS:

No New Business this meeting.

*ADJOURNMENT: President Coburn adjourned the meeting at 9:00 a.m.

*SECRETARY'S REPORT, Continued:

Information is given at the Rotary Information Meeting to new, prospective members (and often appears in Avenues) about the non-use of the Club's Roster for business solicitation purposes. Unfortunately, COG and Past District Governor Roy Massey utilzied the list to announce a new business affiliation. He was been reminded of the Policy and it was again (with no names involved) published in our Avenues Bulletin's columns.

Greg Eisele submitted a regretful Letter Of Resignation. In conversation with the Secretary, it was learned there are serious business pressures and failing health in his Mom's life. Greg expressed an intense desire to return to the Club. It was MSC to allow Greg to return within one year, with new fees waived. This invitation is Board precedent and most recently was extended to Juergen Brinkmann.

Member Bob Whalen addressed the Board regarding failing attendance during the last year. He wishes very much to remain as a participating member and has, at least for now, a much less rigorous work schedule. The Board was pleased to hear his words and is excited that he will remain as a productive member.

The solicitations of current and former members with Past Due Bills is continuing its success. Former members Joyce Constant and John Townsend have each submitted two checks; current member Steve Derenia has further submitted two checks and letters from Joe Wettstead and Gregg Palmer assured a check from each to Treasurer Scott Bristol.

Regarding the upcoming Jazz Festival, Brad Smith and Doug Cords have timely submitted both the ABC Licensure Forms and obtained insurance binder; these steps are now in the FGR program for future events.

Regarding Membership, as noted Juergen Brinkmann was welcomed back in a rousing format by Acting President John Skewes; the membership of Al Trujillo, per last Board meeting, was terminated. Rotary International was regretfully notified of the passing away of Long-time Secretary Paul "Shony" Schoenwald.

There are no New Member Proposals in the Pipeline, for another month.

Circulated was the "RI Council On Legislation" proposals, each's heading underlined, for Board perusal. The Club can object, in writing, by 18 October. The key changes recommended:

*would waive admission fees for members returning "in good standing" *would increase dues on a semi-annual basis as follows:

2004-2005: 19.50 2005-2006: 21.50 2006-2007: 23.50

(Treasurer Scott Bristol will come with a formal dues-increase proposal, when necessary)

*would offer an attendance excuse if the aggregate of the member's years of age and years of Rotary service is 85 or more, with notification to the Secretary and Board Approval.

*SECRETARY'S REPORT, Continued:

The secretary then reviewed for the Board our current By-Law clause, known as the "Rule Of 85," which notes:

- *the member has served in excess of 20 years in Rotary
- *the member has attained the age of 65
- *the member is fully retired

Upon notification to the Secretary and Board Approval, the member is allowed dues reduced to one-half.

It was noted that RI has a "Manual Of Procedure" which two editions previous addressed the Attendance issues of Rotarians of senior age and service, but it was removed in the current Manual, which is "suggestive" only.

Over the years, the "official" policy for such Rotarians has perhaps included dues and attendance issues and needs to be clarified.

It was decided by the Board to retrin the current "Rule Of 85," which addresses retirement, age and numbers of service years and impacts only dues costs.

It was MSC to add the following, as a recommendation to the Ad-Hoc By-Laws Committee, for inclusion in potential By-Laws revisions and additions:

- *create a new category known as "Rotarian Emeritus"
- *the member must have an aggregate of 85, inclusive of age and years of Rotary service
- *retirement and dues issues are not impacted
- *with request to the Secretary and Board Approval, the "Rotarian "Emeritus" can be excused from attendance requirements

Upon attaining the age of 65 and being fully retired, the "Rotarian Emeritus" could then apply for "Rule Of 85" as well.

The Ad-Hoc By-Laws Subcommittee, consisting of Past Presidents Bob Bergin, John Heberger and David Fike and Doug Cords will present to the Board proposed revisions shortly. Bob Bergin is currently reviewing language.

*PRESIDENT-ELECT'S REPORT: (Phil Setrakian)

- b. Recommendation: Delete this section
- c. Rationale: This is presently not happening and it is of little importance when the President elect actually select his sergeant-at-arms.

3. ARTICLE IV, SECTION 1:

- a. Section deals with the election process of club officers.
- b. Recommendation: Include as an eligible officer the Foundation Treasurer.
- c. Rationale: The Foundation Treasurer is a member of both the Club Board of Directors and of the Foundation Board and so his/ her election should also be addressed in the by-laws dealing with the election process.

4. ARTICLE IV, SECTION 4:

- a. Sections mandate monthly meetings of the Board
- b. Recommendation: Insert the words "Unless otherwise directed by the Board, regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held monthly.
- c. Rationale: The Board generally does not meet during the month of June and sometimes not in July; the absolute requirement for monthly meetings should be eliminated.

5. ARTICLE VI, SECTION 1:

- a. Provides for confidential written ballot on measures submitted for Board consideration should any Board member so request.
- b. Recommendation: Eliminate this section.
- c. Rationale: The Board's discussions and actions, unless taken in Executive Session, are a matter of public record and may not be subject to any confidentially.

6. ARTICLE VI, SECTION NEW:

- a. No present section
- b. Recommendation: Provide for the opportunity for the Board to conduct discussions in Executive Session provided a majority of members so vote for such a session and that the matter to be discussed relates solely to one of the following subject areas:
 - i. Any actual or potential legal claim or financial assessment, whether asserted or unasserted against the Club or any Officer or Director acting in their capacity as such.
 - ii. Personnel and membership matters related to the eligibility for membership, continuity or termination of members of the Club, the disclosure of which might be detrimental, hurtful or injurious to the privacy, reputation or personal finances of any member or proposed new member of the Club.
 - iii. The matters which lead to an Executive Session shall be described in very general terms only in the public minutes, the details of such Executive Session discussions shall be strictly confidential and no minutes shall be maintained. All actions of the Board of Directors resulting from discussions in Executive Session shall be taken in a public proceeding. Non-members of the Board of Directors shall be excluded from Executive Session, unless their presence is required to provide information or legal counsel to the Board.

c. Rationale: The present by-laws do not discuss Executive Sessions and when they may be undertaken and in what manner.

7. ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 4(d):

- a. Provides for membership committee to "thoroughly investigate" new member proposals.
- b. Recommendation: Committee may only "evaluate" the new members proposed.
- c. Rationale: This committee does not have any investigative powers as a matter of law and thus cannot conduct any investigation of any kind, as that term is generally understood.

8. ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 4(d), NEW COMPONENT:

a. New section/ provisions.

Recommendation: Require the membership committee to consist of a past president of the Club and two other members exceeds 5 years and who are all in good standing in the Club. In addition to conducting proposed new member evaluations, this committee shall also "Establish policies and practices for acceptable financial performance of members regarding their accounts with the Club, including termination procedures in the event of non-payment or lack of timeliness in paying their accounts. Any policy or procedure so established by the Membership Committee shall be in writing, approved by the Board of Directors and disseminated to the membership prior to its implementation. At its sole discretion, the Committee may work with delinquent members in arranging deferred payment schedules or simply recommend termination of membership, evaluate and review members' past due accounts and make recommendations for continuity and termination of memberships on account of non-payment or lack of timeliness of payment. membership Committee shall receive monthly account agings from the Club Treasurer and make recommendations, no less often than quarterly,

regarding termination of members for non-payment of their accounts. It shall be the responsibility of the Board to decide whether a member is continued or terminated."

c. Rationale: No uniform procedures presently exist for dealing with delinquent members accounts and the administration of such in the past has been inconsistent.

9. ARTICLE IX, SECTION 1(e) NEW

- a. No current provision
- b. Recommendation: Create a new membership category known as "Rotarian Emeritus" which allows, upon request to the Board and receipt of its approval, an excusal from the Club's attendance requirements. Qualification for consideration is that the Member must be less than 65 years of age, still working and meet the "Rule of 85" wherein the sum of the Member's age and years of Rotary service must equal 85. Classification as a Rotarian Emeritus shall have no effect on the Member's dues obligations or retirement status upon the attainment of age 65.
- c. Rationale: Board resolution.

10. ARTICLE XI, SECTION 1(e):

- a. Provides for procedures to be followed in the event of a written objection to a proposed new member.
- b. Recommendation: Require that any written objection may only be delivered to either the President or Secretary and must be signed by the objecting member. Objections may only be mailed or hand delivered, not faxed or electronically mailed, must bear an original signature and provide the basis of the objection and reasons for the possible exclusion of the proposed new member. Objections received by other than the President or Secretary are ineligible for further consideration. Disclosure, at any time, of the objection by the objecting member to other than the President or Secretary shall render the objection moot and it may not be further

considered by the Club or Board. Should the objecting member disclose his/ her objections to other than the President or Secretary, then the proposed member shall be permitted to join the Club without further action by the Board. No disclosure of the objection, or the basis therefor, shall be made by the President or Secretary to the Board, until after the Membership Committee has evaluated the objection. Objections must be immediately forwarded to the Membership Committee for evaluation of the objections now being presented by a member. The evaluation may be conducted as the Committee sees fit based on their assessment of the facts and circumstances of the situation and objections raised. The Membership Committee shall report the results of their evaluation to the Board in Executive Session. Following discussion in Executive Session, the Board shall reconvene in public session and vote on the proposed membership of the applicant. Should the proposed new member applicant receive at least four negative votes, then the proposed new member will be deemed to have been rejected by the Club.

c. Rationale: To eliminate ambiguities in the present by-laws, provide for "due process" to the proposed new member, the objecting member and the Club, as well as to provide protection of confidentiality to the proposed new member.

The foregoing proposed changes to the By-Laws were prepared and approved by the Ad Hoc Committee established for such purpose by the Board of Directors. The Ad Hoc Committee consisted of John Heberger, Doug Cords, Dave Fike and Bob Bergin.

Dear John:

I have reviewed the proposed bylaw changes dated September 7, 2004 by your committee. You asked if I saw any problems. In general, I see no problems. The changes are up to the board and the club members, subject to compliance with California law and Rotary International rules. I have the following specific comments.

Proposed change 7 is based on the rationale that the committee "does not have any investigative powers as a matter of law and thus cannot conduct any investigation of any kind, as that term is generally understood." The Corporations Code section 7310(a) provides in pertinent part: "A corporation may admit persons to membership, as provided in its articles or bylaws, or provide in its articles or bylaws that it shall have no members." I believe the Corporations Code allows the club to "thoroughly investigate" and does not limit the club to "evaluate" the new members. Having said that, the word "evaluate" may better describe what our committee actually does. In that connection, the membership committee may wish to consider running a credit check on proposed new members (see proposed change number 8). If this is desired, the member's written consent to such a credit check would be required. This could easily be done at the same time the application card is signed giving consent to publication of the proposed member's name in the bulletin. However, the existing documents do not include consent to a credit check.

I have no feelings one way or the other on proposed change number 8. Obviously, if a problem exists, it needs to be addressed and the proposed language seems workable. Please note that any procedures developed by this committee would have to be consistent with the membership termination provisions of the bylaws, Article XI, section 2. In that regard, Article XI, section 2 is based upon the requirements of California Corporations Code section 7341(c)

which sets forth the procedural safeguards required in connection with membership termination.

Paragraph 9. One requirement for this category is stated as "less than 65 years of age." This implies that the status is lost upon attaining age 65. It seems like age 65 should not make any difference. My understanding of the Rotary International "Rule of 85" is that attendance requirements are waived when a Rotarian qualifies under the Rule of 85. In addition, if the Rotarian has attained age 65 and is retired, I believe Rotary International provides for one-half dues. I believe if the bylaws are going to create this category for persons under 65 who are not retired, then they should also address a category for people over 65 who are not retired. Another approach is to simply defer to the Rotary International rules for application of the "Rule of 85" without trying to bring it into the club bylaws.

I believe proposed amendment number 10 is also an attempt to address one problem which has occurred. Perhaps the chairman of the membership committee should also be authorized to receive objections. I personally think disclosure of objections to other than the president or secretary should not automatically permit the proposed member to join the club without further board action. The board should never be preempted.

I believe the reference in the last sentence to me as part of the committee should be changed to refer to the committee consisting of you, Doug and Dave, followed by a legal review by me, inasmuch as I have not participated in committee deliberations.

I would appreciate receiving a written document containing amendments as finally approved by the Board of Directors so that my file will remain current and complete.

Please let me know if you have any questions. I hope I have been helpful.

*NEW BUSINESS:

Past President John Heberger continued the discussion from last month's Board Meeting on the subject of Proposed By-Laws Additions and Revisions, specifically focusing upon Article XI, Section 1(3) on the topic of Protocol For New Membership Proposals.

After lengthy discussion, it was MSC to approve the language, as amended, with Board Member Steve Wilson abstaining.

It is the hope of the Playland Board that Fig Garden Rotary would consider a donation to the park for "adoption" of a ride. Any such avenue would require a formal proposal to the Community Service Committee, with regular screening and approval channels. Past President Coburn will search files for a letter from Greg Baxter, in March, outlining possible donation opportunities, if the Club has such an interest. The repayment and any possible future donation are separate issues.

*TREASURER'S REPORT: (Scott Bristol)

Scott reviewed the Balance Sheet, as follows:

*SECRETARY'S REPORT: (Doug Cords)

It was MSC to ratify the Special Board Meeting's decision on 15 October 2004, to grant the title of "Honorary Member" to Founding President Charles (Chuck) Cornett.

The secretary reviewed the "Ducker's Fee" situation, wherein most members and guests who leave the Meeting on Friday early fail to remit the required \$5.00. A notice in Avenues was published recently.

Two members this month are having attendance issues; both Jack Sheldon and Marty Dietz are on the path to submitting enough make-ups to remain members in Good Standing.

The official Termination Notice for former member Dr. Teresa Patterson was filed with Rotary International. The Secretary urged Board Members to keep in contact with Teresa and to encourage her return.

Fig Garden Rotary Policy Proposals

At a meeting of the Investment Committee of the Fig Garden Rotary Foundation on October 6, 2004, the following Policy Statements were formulated for Board consideration.

Proposal 1- Community Service Donations Requiring Membership Approval

Proposed donations by the Club (Foundation) of \$10,000 or more, in either a single payment or in a series of payments, after Board approval, must be approved by the membership of the Club. Said approval shall be preceded by a 14 day notice published in Avenues and taken at a regular meeting during a specially convened Club Assembly. The approval will require a majority vote by written ballot of members present. The vote shall be tallied by any two of the Secretary, Club treasurer, Foundation treasurer and President Elect. If two of the preceding are not available, the President may appoint uninterested member(s) to tally the votes. The outcome of the vote shall be announced prior to the adjournment of the regular meeting.

<u>Proposal 2 – Use of the Permanent Fund</u>

Alternative A – When the value of the Permanent Fund of the Foundation (PF) reaches or exceeds \$250,000, 50% of each subsequent year's earnings shall be available for distribution at the Board's discretion. Earnings are defined as interest, dividends and realized capital gains. Said earnings shall be available through the end of the following fiscal year. Any amount of the PF in excess of \$500,000 shall be available for distribution at any time at the Board's discretion.

Alternative B - Any amount of the PF in excess of \$250,000 shall be available for distribution at any time at the Board's discretion.
