Rotary International has deep roots in North County

Rotary International was founded as a result of one man's vision, to impact positive change on a grand scale. Paul P. Harris was an attorney in Chicago when he formed the Rotary Club, one of the world's first service organizations, Feb. 23, 1905. Now 110 years later, the words that Harris spoke still hold true, "Whatever Rotary may mean to us, to the world it will be known by the results it achieves."

With 1.2 million members internationally it is clear that the result is an expansive membership that can achieve almost anything with the sheer mass of membership and networking ability. Here in the North County, Rotary Club District 5240 is very active according to Rotary International District Governor Loretta Butts.

"In the North County, we have two clubs in Paso Robles, one club in Templeton and another in Atascadero," said Butts with pride. "Most of the clubs are community focused. Most people join to give back to their community. It is a growing organization that is in need of new membership in the form of youth to keep the organization alive for another 100 years. Fortunately up in the North County the clubs work together."

There are nine or 10 clubs that are part of the district of clubs and get together once a month to see

tion, not to mention the fact that in our spare time we are eradicating polio."

Rotary's fight against polio began in 1979 with a project to immunize 6 million children in the Philippines. By 2012, only three countries remain polio-endemic — down from 125 in 1988.

"I have been in Rotary for over 20 years and have been to Nigeria to administer vaccines and seeing these poor children begging on the streets crawling around in the dirt," Butts said, "being able to help and see what is going on in these areas of the world is amazing. We are hoping that by 2018 we will have eradicated it completely. We knocked out India about a year ago and that was the turning point, when we knew we could actually accomplish it."

Rotary International is an inspiration to its members all over the world and here in the North County Butts said they bleed yellow and blue, the official colors of Rotary.

THE ATASCADERO ROTARY CLUB
