The Vocational Training Team (VTT) from Perth, Western Australia, is visiting thanks to the efforts of District 5300's **Michael Driebe**, Vocational Training Team Chair, and District 9455's **Jerry Pilcher**, who holds the same title. The multi-disciplinary team is touring here for three weeks. Its focus is on family and domestic violence (FDV), and members bring diverse and extensive experience and a variety of approaches to that issue from their related professional fields. The Team members are all affiliated with Path of Hope in Western Australia. Path of Hope is an approach that mobilizes the organizational capacity of Rotarians to support agencies and services that provide safety and empowerment to women and their children escaping family and domestic violence.

In 2008 two friends offered to volunteer at a Salvation Army women's safe house in Perth, Western Australia. These two women were members of the Rotary Club of Perth, and with the generous support of the club and the guidance of Salvation Army leaders, developed a strategy





to support the Salvation Army's work with survivors of FDV. In 2013 Path of Hope was formally launched as a collaboration between the Rotary Club of Perth and the Salvation Army in Western Australia.




WELCOME GUESTS AND VISITING ROTARIANS!

Team Leader **Rebecca Tolstoy**, with a background in financial and human resource management, runs a business consulting firm and is Founding Chair of Path of Hope. She was Rotarian of the Year for District 9455 in 2017.

Mark Crake, Senior Policy Officer for the Office of the Public Advocate in Western Australia, has worked in child protection and family support services virtually his entire career.

Sarah-Jane Sharpe, an interior design and marketing specialist, is an active Rotarian and a project leader for Path of Hope.

Darrell Hagen, Police Sergeant with the Western Australia Police Force, has commanded metropolitan and rural police teams and has worked as a police prosecutor and trainer. He is a specialist in family protection and the response to family and domestic violence and has a deep understanding of forensic issues in addressing domestic violence.

Alison Kirby, coach and presentation expert, talked about the <u>Purple Purse</u> of the Allstate Foundation, an initiative that our local <u>House of Ruth</u> highlights in its annual fundraising.

Team members identified several of the area programs that they are exploring for insights to take back home: Tri-Cities Mental Health, which has made presentations to our club, House of Ruth and Pomona Valley Hospital, for protocols on identifying and interdicting human trafficking, to name a few. They'll be exploring throughout the district over these three weeks, which will no doubt fly by too fast and leave them looking forward to a sequel. It is heartening to see our Rotary friends from Australia tackling this issue with such a broad, multi-pronged, humane approach.
