ZOOM MEETING ABOUT POLIO FUNDING


PDG Sylvia Whitlock, our queen of zoom, attended a meeting this week about the funding of Polio Eradication. She'll report about what she learned on October 9.

A few highlights and examples of Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) contributions:

- In addition to AFP, Polio surveillance personnel are not doing COVID-19 sample collection and transport, and monitoring for influenzalike illness and acute respiratory diseases.
- Polio laboratories are involved in testing and providing support and training for COVID-19 testing facilities being established.
- In Pakistan, the polio emergency operations center is providing the data and analyses for COVID-19
- The current pandemic can be an opportunity to further polio transition and integration.
- In Yemen, integrated measles, polio, vitamin supplement and deworming campaigns were done in August and September.

GPEI contributions to COVID-19

- GPEI support to COVID-19 response is substantial and essential.
- In 9 months (April-Dec) nearly 4000 WHO Polio staff and contractors in 58 offices are helping countries to respond.
- The value of WHO Polio's support in that period is \$61M (much of which will be reimbursed to Polio)
- Polio can draw on its extensive experience with vaccine introduction, vaccine logistic and ability to reach remote communities to deliver COVID-19 countermeasures.
- COVID-19 highlights the importance of sustaining capacities supported by the GPEI, for the sake of longer-term preparedness and resilient health systems.
