- Paul P. Harris Founded Rotary, Chicago 2/23/1905
- Rotary was the chosen name because the meetings originally rotated offices
- Name change to Rotary International in 1922
- Rotary launches Polio Plus to wipe out Polio in 1985
- 1987 the first women were welcomed into Rotary
- Your Summerlin Rotary Club charters in 1997

“I joined Rotary to become more involved in my community and gain a greater sense of community.

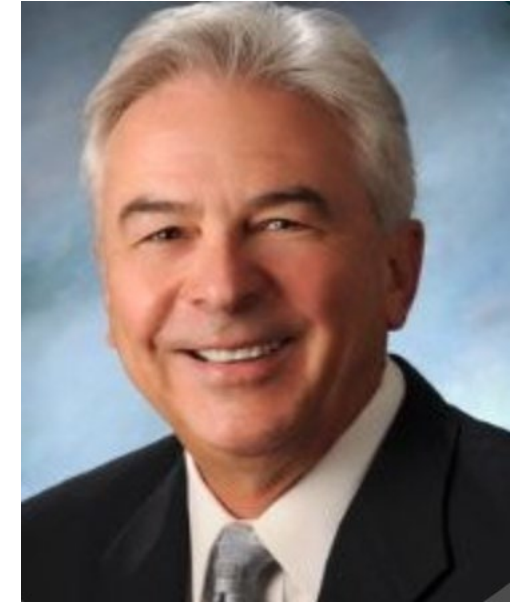
As a new member of Summerlin Rotary I have been gladdened by the level of commitment that members have to our community as well as to each other.

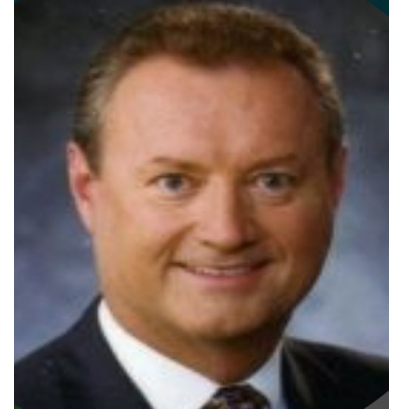
