3. Download **Ignite** app on your mobile phone. You use same login as DACDB login information.



- 4. Set up your account at Rotary international website and sign up for direct giving.
 - a. Go to website: https://my.rotary.org
 - b. Click "Register" at the top corner to create an account.
 - c. Click "Donate" button for Direct Giving to Rotary Foundation. This is an opportunity to give to the Rotary Foundation and become eligible to become Paul Harris Fellow.
- 5. Understand Rotary's 5 Avenues of Service and choose an area to get involved.

Club service works to strengthen fellowship of members through training and hospitality. Clubs have serious topics to work toward, so having various social events that bring members and their guests informally and for fun, contributes to genuine fellowship.

Vocational Service encourages members to serve other people through their vocations, education, skillsets, which encourages high ethical standards. October is Vocation Service Month when the many club service projects are celebrated.

Community Service is exactly what the name implies — projects and activities each club undertakes to improve community life.

International Service volunteers work to expand the Rotarians' humanitarian work around the world. This important service promotes understanding and peace, sponsors projects in other countries and works with international partners to support projects in their communities.

Youth Service works to engage youths and young adults in leadership roles. Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is a training program for young people, ages 14 to 30. The award emphasizes leadership and citizenship. Rotaract is an International Youth Program is for ages 18 to 30 while Interact focuses on international service for youths 12 to 18.
