Tax-deductible charitable contributions from club members through our Annual Pledge Drive and fundraising activities, as well as donations from the public, provide the funding for PRCC that enables it to make a meaningful impact on our local community as well as communities afar.

For the 2021-22 Rotary year, PRCC awarded \$106,672 in grants, scholarships and awards to the local and international organizations listed below. A BIG thank you to the Rotarians and community members whose generous contributions and support made this possible!

### Grant Awards

\$3,000 to Child Crisis Arizona for the Caring for Homeless Children and Youth project.

\$10,000 to Family Promise-Greater Phoenix for the Emergency Shelter Program project.

\$10,000 to Homeless Youth Connection for the Empowering Youth for the Future project.

\$3,500 to the Marine Corps Law Enforcement Foundation for scholarship funding for children of fallen soldiers.

\$2,500 to ShelterBox USA for the Ukraine Crisis Response project.

### International Project Support Donations

\$2,955 for a global grant to a perinatal OB/Gyn training center in Carajpachay, Argentina.

\$550 for a global grant to a Senior Day House in Xalapa Veracruz, Mexico, for Parkinson's therapy.

\$1,575 to a global grant water project in Villa Talandracas, Peru, to construct a booster station to provide water to 3,600 residents.

\$1,000 to the International Rescue Committee ALERT (Arizona League to End Regional Trafficking) program to purchase laptops/tablets and provide internet coverage for 35 survivors of human trafficking.

\$1,000 to the Guatemala Literacy Project to improve education for underserved students in Guatemala.
