

RIDE TO END POLIO Rotary (Cycling to Serve

District 5500 is pleased to once again welcome the Rotary International Fellowship Cycling to Serve as our Presenting Sponsor. For many years, the Fellowship has supported the ride financially and they have adopted the Ride to End Polio as their signature event. We look forward to many more years of working together to end polio worldwide, and to support other Rotary efforts into the future.

In 2009, Rotarian Mike Harris was able to enroll Polio Plus as one of many non-profit beneficiaries to participate in El Tour de Tucson. Fast forward to 2023 and the Ride to End Polio, assisted by the Gates Foundation two-to-one match, has raised more than \$60 million to aid in Rotary's fight to end polio, <u>one of if not THE single largest fund raiser in the history of Rotary.</u>

This year's Ride to End Polio will be held on Saturday, November 18 and once again features new routes aimed to make the ride safer and more enjoyable. POLIO UPDATE

In 1985 Rotary International made the audacious pledge to eradicate polio world-wide. It would be only the second disease to be eradicated, after Smallpox in 1980. In 1985, there were 360,000 cases a year in 125 countries of paralytic polio, primarily in children.





In 1988 the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) was formed when Rotary acquired partners World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the U.S. Center for Disease Control.


In recent years, the Gates Foundation has been a generous supporter and partner. Using the Sabin oral vaccine, volunteer Rotarians and health workers around the world began vaccinating children. To date approximately 4 billion children have received the precious drops. Because of that, it is estimated 21 million children have been spared the scourge of polio.

Every year since the vaccination program began in 1985, the number of new cases worldwide has gone down. Of the remaining two countries where polio remains endemic, through August, 2023 Afghanistan has had 5 cases and Pakistan only 2 cases.

Though we are getting "This Close," Rotarians must continue to support the effort. The creation of this Team, along with a Senior Advisory Group, is a proactive attempt to further develop our District's grant programs.


