### The 2023 Rotary District 5500 Results Michael J. Harris Memorial Ride to End Polio -- Nov. 18, 2023



This year's Ride to End Polio drew almost 80 cyclists from Arizona, California. Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oregon, Rhode Island, Texas, Washington and the US Virgin Islands.

In 2009, Rotarian Mike Harris was able to enroll Polio Plus as one of many non-profit beneficiaries to participate in El Tour de Tucson. Fast forward to 2023 and the Ride to End Polio, assisted by the Gates Foundation two-to-one match has raised more than \$65 million to aid in Rotary's fight to end polio, one of if not THE single largest fund raiser in the history of Rotary.

Each year we are proud to assert that all of the funds raised in the Ride to End Polio go toward eradication, and not to support the ride operations. However, it costs to put on a ride of this size, and we are grateful for the support of the Rotary Fellowship of Cycling to Serve. Work on over \$500,000 in projects with friends from all over the world!

In October, Rotarians from District 5500 went up to Prescott for the annual USA Mexico Friendship Conference and Global Grant Exchange. 90 Rotarians from 6 Rotary Districts in Arizona, California and Mexico reviewed 14 Global Grant projects. Our District Rotary Foundation Team pledged \$40,000 in District Designated Funds (DDF) on eight of the projects and the Tubac Rotary Club pledged funds on three projects.



#### **TUCSON ROTARY**

Tucson Rotary has received a District Grant to do the required Community Assessment for a GG in Senegal. The ultimate goal is to help forgotten street children in a rural village near Dakar, Senegal, West Africa.

Tubac Rotary has received a District Grant to do the required Community Assessment for a GG in Mexico. The ultimate goal is to establish a program enhancing cleft lip and cleft palate surgeries.

#### ARIZONA ROTARY MICROCREDIT PROGRAM

Three Global Grants, from 2013-2018, totaling \$274,000 established the basis for this program which is shared between D5500 & D5495 in Arizona. Businesses in Hermosillo, Mexico getting loans must have an 18 month history and looking for expansion capital. Loans start range from \$300 to \$1000.

Green Valley and Valle Verde are Partners in the Arizona Microcredit Committee, committing \$5,000 over 5 years and other clubs who have donated to the program are Casas Adobes, Mountain Empire, Tubac and Tucson Sunrise.
