
Global Grant Fellowships/Scholarships must relate to one or more of the seven areas of Rotary focus, have a long-term impact, and must be for a graduate-level program.

Global Grant Fellowships/Scholarships must be sustainable and measurable (How will the scholar's studies support one or more of the areas of focus?). The global grant scholarship/fellowship is \$35,000.

Global Grant Fellowships (Scholarship) fund studies for a period of one to four academic years in graduate-level programs. Fellowship/Scholarship funds may be used for tuition, room, and board, books, travel expenses, visas, inoculations, as well as any humanitarian projects the club or district has planned that relate to the scholar's studies.

Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus

- PEACE AND CONFLICT PREVENION/ RESOLUTION
- DISEASE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT
- WATER AND SANITATION
- MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH
- BASIC EDUCATION AND LITERACY
- ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT
- ENVIRONMENT

EXCLUSIONS:

Scholar may NOT be (1) a Rotarian; (2) an employee of a club, district, or other Rotary entity, or of Rotary International; (3) the spouse, a lineal descendant (child or grandchild by blood or stepchild legally adopted or not), the spouse of a lineal descendant, or an ancestor (parent or grandparent by blood) of any person in the foregoing two categories.
