Support of Global Grants around the world: \$60,668

We supported 16 new Rotary Global Grant projects valued at 1.64 million in countries India, Serbia, Nigeria, Thailand and Honduras. The District contribution to these projects were matched 1:1 by the World Fund of the Rotary Foundation. Three of these Global Grants are sponsored by Heart 2 Heart, a consortium of Rotary Districts in Zone 30-31 known as the Heart of America Districts and the Districts in the Heart of Mexico. Rotarians in Mexico submit projects related to literacy, education, health, and economic development and seek funding support from Heart of American Districts. District 6060 has been supporting these worthwhile Heart 2 Heart 2 Heart projects for many years.
