How We Spent the District Designated Grant

Community Assistance Project Grants to Rotary Clubs in District 6060: \$29,341

Twenty-six clubs received grants to support 33 local community projects throughout the district.

Club-initiated International Project Grants: \$7331

Forest Park (2), Wentzville, and DeSoto participated in international projects in Kenya, St. Vincents and the Grenadines, Rwanda and Guatemala by partnering with Rotarians in each of those countries.

Cultural Exchange with District 4945: \$1011

HR Sheevam, Ken Heischmidt and their spouses visited the bi-national District 4945 in Argentina/Uruguay.

Youth Exchange: \$1472

For the first time, DDF helped offset the travel expenses of Rotary Youth Exchange students attending the South Central Regional Youth Exchange Program in Oklahoma.

Ambassadorial Scholarship: \$25,000

Kate MacLachlan, a graduate student in Public Health at Washington University, was this year's Ambassadorial Scholar.

Additional Scholarships: \$6000

Evan Dalton attending Îndiana University and Karen Miramatsu attending John Hopkins University each received \$3000 scholarships toward their graduate studies in a Rotary area of focus.

District Donation to Polio Eradication: \$58,352

Factoring in the 50 cents on the dollar match by TRF and then the 2 to 1 match by the Gates Foundation, our impact on Polio eradication equates to \$262,584.

Donation to Peace Scholar Program: \$25,000


Having donated \$25K to this program since its inception, District 6060 has been designated as a Peace Builder District.

Contingency funds: \$8500

Contingency funds are used to support unexpected opportunities during the year. This year funds were used for the food packing project during District Conference, Shelter Box, and South Africa Library Project.

Support of Global Grants around the world: \$70,000

We supported 15 Rotary projects in 8 countries valued at \$1.1 million. The District contribution to these projects is matched 1 to 1 by the World Fund of The Rotary Foundation. Two of the Global Grants were written by Rotarians in the Washington R.C. and West St. Louis County R.C.
