DISTRICT 6060 CLUBS WILL PROMOTE PEACE ON WORLD PEACE DAY -






<u>Travel to Uganda this October</u> for a life-changing experience. Cindy Duncan d'Arden, a member of the West St. Louis County Rotary Club, and her husband will be returning to Uganda in late October to check on currently sponsored projects and to investigate new ones. They are especially interested in identifying 6 new villages that need clean water and putting together a global grant.

In June Rotarian Milton Tusingwire, from Fort Portal, Uganda, visited District 6060 and spoke to several clubs about his work to improve the lives of the most impoverished through sponsorships for school children and teaching business skills, farming, and health prevention to the most needy.

Total cost roundtrip – including spending and tips- would be just under \$5000. You need a current passport. If you are not vaccinated you just need a negative test 24 hours prior to leaving the U.S.



OUR FIGHT TO END POLIO NEEDS US NOW MORE THAN EVER!

New PolioPlus Society Launching - Be A Charter Member by giving at least \$100 to support ending polio. Many thanks to **Linda Puchbauer**, District Rotary Foundation Chair and **Tom Drennan**, District Polio Chair for developing this new District recognition program to highlight those who are directly eradicating polio from the face of the earth. We hope you'll join us this year!







Last year 109 Rotarians (of nearly 2,000 members) in our District gave \$38,171.86 Yes, this is outstanding and worthy of celebration, but we can do even BETTER this year if more of us step up to the plate! Since beginning this fight Rotarians around the world have contributed more than \$2.1 Billion to protect nearly three billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decision by governments around the world to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort and even more importantly, insist that children receive vaccinations.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate child in the Phillippines in 1979. The threat of a re-emergence of this dreaded disease in previously polio-free countries is now a global concern. We need your continued support to WIN THIS FIGHT!

Because of the passion many of you have in seeing this through to the end, a boots-on-the-ground initiative in our District to prevent the spread of Polio in the Missouri is being considered and developed. More information will be available soon as details and plans unfold.


