What is Interact?

Interact is Rotary International's service club for young people ages 12 to 18. Interact clubs are sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which provide support and guidance, but they are self-governing and self-supporting.



Club membership varies greatly. Clubs can be single gender or mixed, large or small. They can draw from the student body of a single school or from two or more schools in the same community.

Each year, Interact clubs complete at least two community service projects, one of which furthers international understanding and goodwill. Through these efforts, Interactors develop a network of friendships with local and overseas clubs and learn the importance of:

- · Developing leadership skills and personal integrity
- · Demonstrating helpfulness and respect for others
- · Understanding the value of individual responsibility and hard work
- · Advancing international understanding and goodwill

As one of the most significant and fastest-growing programs of Rotary service, with more than 13,500 clubs in over 100 countries and geographical areas, Interact has become a worldwide phenomenon. Over 310,000 young people are involved in Interact

The \$50 fee will enter each golfer into a 50/50 pool, with half of the proceeds benefiting EndPolioNow, and the other half going back to the field.

9-Hole Golf Course — "The Juniors" Cedar Creek's 9-hole par three golf course is entertaining for novice and expert golfers alike. Originally built by Charles Vatterott Jr. in 1953 as a 3 hole course it was expanded in 2001 and reimagined and designed by John Vatterott Jr. to accommodate casual golfers and players looking to be challenged. The gorgeous scenery sets "The Juniors" apart and continues to delight players of all levels.






GET YOUR CLUB ON TRACK FOR SUCCESS!

Rotary Foundation Trustee Larry Lunsford ignited the passions of all gathered at Show Me Rotary as he discussed the project's potential impact. Our district's champions (the Shoe Cheerleaders!) are Dan Flynn and Mike Sorensen. Mike was so moved. he's launching a campaign he's jokingly calling the "Bury Larry" campaign. Mike has established a District goal of 20,000 pairs of new children's shoes to be collected by April 20, 2024 where our mountain of shoes will be counted and loaded into shipping crates for transport to the international distribution center in Dallas operated by our partner organization Buckner International.
