

## **IMAGINE ROTARY TOUR '22 WAS AWESOME!**

Here are some anecdotal observations Governor Julie shared:

- Rotarians in all fifty communities rock! There are just a lot of really good people in District 6060.
- In clubs where the **4-Way Test** is proudly displayed and recited at meetings, members know it and live it! You can just feel it.
- Clubs that have solid, well-trained, and enthusiastic leadership in place (The President doesn't do everything; they have a way to identify and engage club leadership well in advance - Pres, Pres-Elect, Pres-Nominee, Secretary/Treasurer; and projects are imagined, planned and executed by many members) are thriving and enjoying the journey of Rotary.
- Clubs that have one or more members welltrained in DACdb or Club Runner (Webster Groves ) have a huge advantage.
- Clubs with strong and well-trained administrative leaders - secretaries, executive secretaries, treasurers, etc. in place reduce the stress of Presidents significantly.
- Clubs whose leaders attended Show Me Rotary have a huge advantage, understand their roles, are generally growing, and have lots less stress in leading their clubs.
   Attendance at Show Me Rotary matters!
- Clubs with new members are energized and inspired to serve better!
- Clubs who offer many ways for members to be engaged and lead, are succeeding.
- Clubs that are actively engaging their members in projects where everyone knows that their role matters, are having great success.
- Clubs with **leaders who care about their members** and meet them where they are are having success!
- Clubs that celebrate small and large wins, recognize their successes and enjoy the experience, are succeeding.
- Clubs that are finding ways to jazz up meetings and the experiences of being together, are growing.




