

ROTARY DISTRICT 6060 ELECTS NEW '25-26 GOVERNOR!

Welcome to the District Governor Line Rotarian Ralph Zuke!

Rotarian RALPH ZUKE, youngest of five children, was born and raised in Adelphi, MD. After graduating from the University of Maryland with a degree in education, he moved to St Louis in August 1991 and began his career as a general contractor who specializes in historic renovations.

In October 2008 Ralph was asked to join the Rotary Club of Fairview Heights. He learned early on just how effective Rotary is in making a positive change in peoples' lives, not just locally but internationally. In his first three years, he helped champion international clean water grants in Libya, India, and Guatemala.

A few years later, Ralph committed to the Rotary goal of eradicating Polio worldwide. He has done many activities to raise money and awareness for the Rotary Foundation's Polio Plus, including riding his bike while pulling a Barcalounger Rickshaw from St. Louis to Toronto in 2018, doing a 24-hour bike ride in 2021, and again cycling while pulling the Barcalounger Rickshaw from St Louis to Houston in 2022.

In 2019 Ralph wanted to start a second St Louis City club. This resulted in the creation of the Civilians, a satellite club of the Rotary Club of St. Louis. He is currently serving as its chair for the 2022-2023 year. Ralph is also an Assistant Governor and has begun providing direct support to clubs in the District in this role.

Ralph is married to Danielle and together they have four children (Madelaine - 26, Finn - 22, Calvin -21, and Quinn - 19). He enjoys cooking and baking for guests as often as possible and hosts a family dinner most weekends.

Ralph often tells people that he views Rotary as a giant cogged wheel; a cogged wheel where he is one of 1.3 million gears helping to move the whole thing forward. In return, the momentum of the other 1.3 million gears helps move him forward as well.

Ralph is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow.

OUR FOUNDATION GRANTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE AT HOME AND THROUGHOUT THE WORLD

Thank you for your contributions to the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund. Your generosity matters so much. We are so grateful!

Each year the District's Foundation team leads the District in raising awareness and funding for the Rotary Foundation; their most powerful responsibility, however, is coordinating with clubs and Rotary leaders to manage, distribute and optimize our Foundation funds. What a great job to have in Rotary! And we are so grateful for these leaders who ensure we are the best stewards of our resources, and stretch them as far as we can to do the most good at home and in the world! So many need us to help.

For the last three years our Foundation team has been ably led by Past District Governor Linda Puchbauer. Rotarian Brian Kohlberg will assume this role for the next three years and is currently assembling his District Foundation team. Our Foundation team's plan for the **\$111,000** available in '22-23 (as shared in this year's Action Plan) was as follows:

- Offering \$36,000 to fund District Community Assistance
 Program (CAP) grants to 51 clubs and Rotaract Clubs
- Providing \$15,000 to fund an Ambassadorial Scholarship available for one scholar
- Contributing \$22,200 to Polio Plus to End Polio Now
- Contributing \$25,000 to Peace Center to remain a Peace Building District
- Offering \$8,300 for Global Grants
- Donating \$1,000 to Shelter Box
- Making available \$1,300 for Admin Fees and \$2200 for Contingency







OUR FOUNDATION GRANTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE AT HOME AND THROUGHOUT THE WORLD (CONTINUED)

The most locally visible impact of our Foundation funding comes through our Community Action Project (CAP) grants to clubs each year. An earlier newsletter detailed the incredible work being done in communities throughout our District using these District grants distributed to clubs. Thank you Rotarians for the innovative ways you serve your communities.



Recently we learned from the Foundation team that we had District grant money remaining for this year. That same Foundation team communicated the availability of those resources, orchestrated an evaluation and allocation process, and recently distributed those funds. Eight clubs in the District who were immediately responsive to the grant funding opportunity, had service projects ready to go, and had contributed to the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund this year were selected.

Perhaps not as visible, but certainly a powerful influence on our District's ability to meet needs in the world are our Global Grants.. This year, we are participating in the following Global Grants:

 New Theory Farming in Thailand - Since their dry climate prevents crops from surviving, they are teaching farmers to use ponds to raise fish for supplement income. Partner with District 3350: GG2343307

- 2. Equipment for Ophthalmological in Argentina This grant enables the purchase of medical equipment in partnership with District 4945 with whom District 6060 previously had a Friendship Exchange: GG2238469
- **3. Rainwater Containment in Mexico** This grant is in partnership with the Zone's Heart 2 Heart (H2H) project; It enables the construction of dams and teaches local rural communities how to gather rainwater to mitigate soil erosion in partnership with District 4170: GG2237889
- **4. Water Saves Lives in Philippines** This grant led by the Rotary Club of St. Louis enables construction of a deep well, pump, and drinking station for Elementary Schools. Partner with District 3770: GG2346775
- **5. Equipment for Surgery Department in India** Grant is with Forest Park Rotary Club to purchase equipment for the Pediatric Surgery Ward for NICU+PICU. Partner with District 3131: GG2345434



We also have <u>three projects that are under development</u>. Upon final approval/authorization by The Rotary Foundation, they will be given numbers, and the projects will commence.

1. Equipment for Oncology in Argentina - To purchase much needed medical equipment in partnership with District 4945 with whom District 6060 had a Friendship Exchange.

PROJECTS UNDER DEVELOPMENT... CONTINUED

- **2. Equipment for Cath Lab and Ultrasound in India** Grant is with Crestwood Sunset Hills Rotary Club and will purchase medical equipment in partnership with District 3060.
- **3. Purchase infant manikins for East Caribbean or India** Grant is with Forest Park Rotary Club and will purchase infant training manikins for healthcare and community leaders.

In addition, to respond to the recent disaster in Turkey, we are giving \$2,000 District Designated Funds to Rotary International's **Turkey Earthquake Fund**.


in the **Perform for Polio** evening at this year's District Conference!

AMBASSADORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The District 6060 Ambassadorial Scholarship opportunity for the 2023-2024 year is <u>accepting applications NOW through April 15, 2023</u>.

This district-supported scholarship is available for study in any academic field, but preference is given to those whose field of study is related to one of the areas of humanitarian needs listed below. Applicants must have completed their bachelor's degree prior to submitting an application. There is no upper age limit to receive the scholarship. Applicants may be graduate students, may have completed one or more degrees, and/or may be engaged in the early stages of a career. The program provides a grant in the amount of "up to" \$15,000 to one (1) student to apply towards tuition, fees, room and board, educational supplies, and round-trip transportation to/from the study site.

Preferred fields of study related to the seven (7) humanitarian focus areas:

- Peace and conflict prevention and/or resolution
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development
- Environment

Completed applications should be submitted to the president of a local Rotary club for the club's review and approval. The application is then sent by the Club President, no later than April 15, 2023, to Ken Heischmidt, District Scholarship Chair.

Don't wait to share this opportunity!

***Rotarians and relatives of Rotarians are not eligible to apply for a Rotary scholarship. However, members of Rotaract clubs are eligible and encouraged to apply, provided that they meet all other eligibility criteria.


