# LAST CHANCE!!!! THE ROTARY FOUNDATION MATCHING PROGRAM 2023-2024

Starting October 15, 2023 through January 15, 2024, your donations to the Annual Programs Fund will be matched with Recognition Points!

With a focus on helping all District 6060 Rotarians reach their first Paul Harris Fellowship(PHF) level, we will be matching 2 points for each dollar, for any donors that have not reached their first PHF. All donations \$50 to \$500 will be matched for these not yet PHF members.

All other Rotarians that have reached PHF will have donations from \$100 to \$500 matched at .5 points for every \$1. Make a minimum donation of \$100 up to \$500 to the Annual Programs Fund via check or directly to the Foundation on MyRotary.org and you will receive a matching contribution from Rotarians who have donated their points to support you.

At this moment, we plan to have 40,000 donated points to share with members not yet reaching their first PHF and another 15,000 for others! Any unused points from either group may be redistributed in January to further incentivize our annual giving.

Last year 75 PE's responded to a survey saying the hotel was the biggest negative factor in attending PETS.

Since we had a valid contract for the 2024 SMR year with the Capitol Plaza hotel in Jefferson City, we were legally into obligated into using their hotel. However, we were allowed to move to another Atrium hotel. Springfield's University Plaza was the only one that was large enough for us to conduct our event and it is very nice. The Show Me Rotary council decided it was the best move for the entire state to move the event to Springfield...even though it is much farther for many of us.

For the 2025, 2026, and 2027 years, we are moving to the Holiday Inn Executive Center in Columbia which is more in the center of the state.

As for the training, we are mixing it up and offering many topics to choose from this year. District-supported scholarship is available for study in any academic field, but preference is given to those whose field of study is related to one of the areas of humanitarian need listed below. Applicants may be a graduate student, or may have completed one or more degrees and/or be engaged in the early stages of a career. There is no upper age limit, but applicants must have completed their Bachelor Degree prior to submitting an application.

The program provides for a grant in the amount of up to \$15,000 for the 2023-24 Rotary year to pay for tuition, fees, room and board, educational supplies, and round-trip transportation to/from the study site. Scholars must account for all expenditures and must provide funding to cover all costs that exceed the amount provided by Rotary. All unspent funds must be returned to Rotary.

Global Scholarships are supported jointly by District funds and by a Global Grant from the World Fund of the Rotary Foundation



Scholarships are available only to applicants whose field of study and career plans pertain directly to one or more of the following seven humanitarian focus areas:

- 1) Peace and conflict prevention and/or resolution
- 2) Disease prevention and treatment
- 3) Water and sanitation
- 4) Maternal and child health
- 5) Basic education and literacy
- 6) Economic and community development
- 7) Environment

#### **IMPORTANT DEADLINES**

**January 31**, annually – deadline for applicants to submit completed application form to a local Rotary club for endorsement

**April 15**, annually – deadline for club presidents to mail endorsed applications to the District Scholarship Chair

**April** annually – interviews of endorsed applicants by the District 6060 Scholarship Committee. (Virtually)
