### **WELCOME TO ROTARY YEAR 2023-2024!**

This year we have **three big initiatives for our District and Clubs** as we embody the new Rotary International theme: **Create Hope in the World**.

Shoe Drive: Our District is joining with our neighboring Missouri Rotary Districts 6040 and 6080 in a **statewide shoe drive**. Our campaign has been named "Let's Bury Larry" by Mike Sorensen, First Man of District 6060. Larry Lunsford is a current Trustee of The Rotary Foundation. Back in 2002, when Larry was governor of District 6040, he partnered with Buckner International in the Shoes for Orphan Souls shoe drive. This drive has continued in District 6040 ever since. In 2005, Districts 6060 and 6080 joined in and all three districts collected over 70,000 pairs of shoes. This year we are bringing the shoe drive back with a goal of collecting 20,000 pairs of shoes from our district alone. **These close-toed, new shoes** will go to vulnerable children in the United States and around the world. Having proper shoes promotes health, disease prevention, and access to education where shoes are required to attend school.

Since the Shoe Drive Kick-off at Show Me Rotary, our District's Clubs have brought shoes to the District Conference and Installation Dinner. The number of shoes currently at Valerie and Mike's house is 118 pairs. We are on our way to our 20,000 goal. **Success stories are pouring in** from clubs with strategies in collecting shoes, such as clearance and BOGO deals to maximize their buying dollars. Great Job!! We will collect your club's shoes at the District Governor visits.

Appoint a Club Shoe Champion to track the number of shoes your club collects. We have the final collection and roll call at the Funvention at Margaritaville on April 19-21, 2024.


