

Shoe Final Totals

What an Awesome Showing by District 6060 Rotary Clubs!

We gathered 19,707 pairs of shoes for vulnerable children around the world. The cash amount of \$12,591 was also donated. When converting the cash to shoes at \$15 per pair that totals 839 pairs.

With the conversion, we reached 20,546 pairs. Our Sole Man, Mike Sorensen, gave us an audacious goal of 20,000 pairs of shoes and we reached it! Mike's monthly emails for shoe totals will end, but I am so thankful for his persistence for the kids. The district probably could not have collected nearly this amount without Mike's help and organization. THANK YOU, MIKE!!

In this shoe competition, the Rotary Club of Arnold had the highest number of shoes at 3919 pairs. The Rotary Club of Cottleville/Weldon Spring had the highest per capita pairs of shoes at 158.24 pairs per member (includes cash donations converted at \$15 per pair).

In appreciation for these clubs' efforts, **Governor Valerie will be donating 1,000 Rotary Foundation Recognition Points to each club**. The clubs can decide how to distribute the points among their Rotarians. Congratulations Arnold and Cottleville/Weldon Spring!

Thank you to all the District 6060 Rotarians that participated in this massive Shoe Drive. We buried Larry and the other Missouri districts, too.

NAVAJO WATER PROJECT

Navajo Water Project Finals: As of 4/30/24 - \$13,642 = 3.03 houses

Thank you for your donations! We exceeded our goal of \$9,000 by collecting \$13,642. This equates to just over three Navajo homes receiving complete water systems. We have concluded this district project for this Rotary year. However, DGE Jerry Nolen, as our Presidents-Elect and Presidents-Nominee heard at Show Me Rotary, is continuing the Navajo Water Project into 2024-25.



On the Navajo Nation, 30% of families live without running water. They drive for miles to haul barrels of water to meet their basic needs. They carefully ration water for drinking, cooking, cleaning and bathing. But despite their struggle for water, these families still go to work, take their children to school and lead their communities.

Running water is transformation. We're on a mission to get clean, hot and cold running water to more households, so families can stop hauling and start enjoying the simple miracle of a working tap.
