The Bolivar Rotary Board approved the following motion 2/10/2017:

"Our club will recognize Rotarians who have been an Active paying member of our local club for 20years by granting them **TWO** years Honorary Membership when they resign from the club (as long as they are and remain in good standing and full-fellowship). We will grant an **additional ONE year** Honorary status for each additional 10 years of Active service (beyond the initial 20 years) the member had accumulated by the time they resigned from Active membership."

[e.g. A member with 50 years Active service in the Bolivar Rotary Club would be given Honorary-Past Active membership for 5 years. However, the board has to officially grant, or re-grant, a member's Honorary status each year.]

"Honorary Members" do not pay dues and do not hold a vocational classification. They are informally recognized by our club as members AND they are allowed to attend <u>ALL</u> meetings and events. Attendance is optional for all Honorary members. Meal status for these "Honorary-Past Actives" is the same as for Rule-of-85, in that they should pay for meals when they attend, but are entitled to the following special meals at no additional cost: Christmas, Family Picnic, Valentines, and Awards Banquet during their Honorary membership period. As per Rotary rules, no Honorary member can vote or be an office holder.

NOTE: The old "Past-Active" designation (retired by Rotary in 2001 but currently held by six remaining Bolivar Rotarians) is to be grandfathered with no changes.
