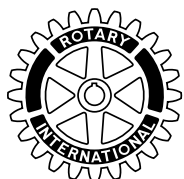
be Rotarians, and Rotarians involve young leaders more in their efforts.

Rotaractors completed the community assessments; Rotarians approached suppliers and purchased materials, together with the Rotaractors. Everything was accomplished in partnership. Now Rotarians and Rotaractors are working together to distribute ventilators.
